#### vs. Miramar Rangers

## ALL IN THE OLYMPIC FAMILY

#### When Alex Davies made his debut against Waterside Karori recently he became the latest in a long line of players who had family also play for the first team.

The detailed data we have only dates back to 1970, our first season after promotion to the Central League structure, so this article will likely miss some of the instances of multiple family members playing for the club prior to that. Where there are known pre-1970 family members of post 1970 first team players, these have been included - apologies in advance to anyone who has been missed.

One of the earliest examples is the Palamidas family. Brothers Chris (Hristsos) **Palamidas** and **Con** (**Constantinos) Palamidas** both played for the original Apollon club. Both were inducted into the Wellington Olympic Hall of Fame in 2020 and Con still attends many matches with his bell. Two of Chris' sons **Tony Palamidas** (163 matches with 13 goals between 1983 and 1993) and **Dimi Palamidas** (5 matches in 1984) also played. In all of Dimi's 5 appearances both Tony and Dimi started.

Also from the early days is the Bertos family. Four brothers Leonidas. Bertos, Vasso Bertos, Laki (Evangelos) Bertos, and Taki (Dimitrios) Bertos played first team football mostly pre-1970 with Taki playing 12 matches in the 1970 season. Taki, Laki and Leonidas were all inducted into the Wellington Olympic Hall of Fame between 2020 and 2021.

That 1970 season also saw the next generation playing with Leonidas's sons **Christos Bertos** (60 matches between 1970 and 1975) and **George Bertos Snr** (178 matches and 37 goals between 1974 to 1989). The observant amongst you will spot the anomaly on George Snr's dates – his 1970 appearances are not included given that he was still at college at the time and so he, as was the norm back then, was on the team list under an assumed name! Christos started 6 matches alongside his uncle Taki and 2 when brother George Snr was also down on the team sheet as starting. George

Snr would go on to coach the first team a record 156 times. Both brothers were inducted into the Wellington Olympic Hall of Fame - Christos in 2021 and George Snr in 2024.

Two more Bertos family members also played in the 1970s with **George Bertos Jnr** (21 matches between 1976 and 1982) and **Jimmy Bertos** (11 matches in 1979). George Jnr and Jimmy were Laki's sons and both started matches with George Snr – Jimmy 9 matches and George Jnr 3 matches. George Jnr, like his cousin George Snr, may have played more matches under an assumed name given that he was still at college when he started.

The end of the millennium saw the third generation take to the field with George Snr's sons **Leo Bertos** (53 matches with 7 goals between 1997 and 2000) and **Adam Bertos** (9 matches with 1 goal between 2000 and 2002). Leo and Adam only played one match together when Adam made his debut as a substitute in a 2-0 win against Wanganui. Leo, of course, became a household name playing over 100 times for the Wellington Phoenix and making over 50 international appearances in South Africa in 2010.

Our first ever Central League Two match in 1970, a 1-3 loss to Northern, included brothers **Jeff Allen** (38 games with 24 goals between 1970 and 1971) and **Wally Allen** (84 games with 13 goals between 1970 and 1974). The brothers started 37 games together so Jeff only played one match without Wally. Given that they both started the first match in 1970 and their surname begins with 'A' the Allen brothers are caps #1 and #2 in our post 1970 records. It is unclear if they played together in 1969 since we don't have those records although I suspect that they did being brought in by Billy Wright who became our first non-Greek coach in 1969.

Another three generational family is the Leonidas family. **Ioannis Leonidas** (better known by the name Pitikos) played for Apollon (he is in the photo in the clubrooms) in the 1950s while his son **Costa Leonidas** (133 matches with 38 goals between 1974 and 1992) and grandson **Michael Leonidas** (21 matches between 2002 and 2005) also played. Costa also coached the first team in the first golden age (1994 to 1995 where we reached the Chatham Cup final and National League for the first time) and again in 2002 – we have not had a coach of Greek heritage for the first team since then.

1974 also saw the first appearance of the Halikias family. Peter Halikias (72 matches with 3 goals between 1974 and 1982) was joined the following season by brother Nick Halikias (359 matches with 53 goals between 1975 and 1993). The brothers started 43 matches together playing in 67 matches together once substitute appearances are taken into account. Peter was in the team when Nick made his debut in a 2-2 draw against Adriatic. The brothers made history for us by both scoring goals in the 6-2 win against Glen Carron in Central Two in 1980. Peter also coached the promotion winning team in 1982 while both Peter and Nick have held the post of Presidents (GOYANZ) and Chairman (Olympic). Peter was inducted into the Wellington Olympic Hall of Fame in 2022.

Peter's son **Maki Halikias** (220 matches with 47 goals between 2001 and 2018) made his first appearance with the first team in 1994 at the Chatham Cup final albeit as a mascot before going on to captain the side that lifted the Cup for the first time in 2009 when we were unbeaten all season. Maki stepped down from the first team at an early age after the 2015 season but answered an SOS and came back for one match in 2018 playing the only time with his cousin, Nick's son, **Lukas Halikias** (62 matches with 6 goals between 2018 and 2024) in a match against Lower Hutt City when a number of first teamers had been selected for the Reserves to try to stave off relegation from Capital Premier.

Nikolaos Androutsos (Nick) (also a former President) (inducted into the Wellington Olympic Hall of Fame in 2020) was another pre-1970 player whose brother Dimitrios Androutsos (Taki/Jim) (3 matches in 1972) played after our detailed records began. Both their sons played in the 1970s – Nick's son Costa Androutsos (1 match in 1975) and Taki's son Spiros Androutsos (233 matches with 90 goals between 1977 and 1995). Spiros had the honour of scoring the first goal under the name Wellington Olympic in a 1-1 draw against Masterton at the start of the 1983 season.

George Kotrotsos (188 matches with 9 goals between 1980 and 1998) was in the starting lineup for the match against Petone at Miramar Park which Olympic lost 0-1 in April 1989 when his brother **Paul Kotrotsos** (221 matches between 1989 and 2003) made his debut. They made 36 starts together over the years. Paul had over 50 clean sheets in his 221 appearances. He went on to become President/Chairman first by himself and then jointly with Basil Bouzoukis. In the final Central League match of the 2021 season, Scott Basalaj having scored a penalty in the first half handed over the gloves at half time to Paul's son **Chris Kotrotsos** (2 matches between 2021 and 2022). Paul and Chris thus became the second father and son goalkeepers after **Jack and Sacha Nathu**.

Brothers **Ian Minshull** (154 matches with 14 goals between 1993 and 2008) and **Gary Minshull** (142 matches with 13 goals between 1994 and 1999) started a staggering 112 matches together including the 1994 Chatham Cup final. Their last match together was a 0-2 loss to Lower Hutt City in the 1999 North Island League. Ian would come back for one final match – a 1-6 loss against Napier City Rovers at Park Island in August 2008. Ian's son **Dan Minshull** (39 matches with 2 goals between 2008 and 2019) had debuted a couple of weeks earlier in the home match against the same opponents and may have also been at the Park Island match. There is no record of Dan having taken the field for lan's last match even if Dan had been there, which he thinks he was.

The family without Greek heritage with most appearances is **Imre Foldi** (217 matches with 88 goals between 1990 and 1999) and his son **Chas Lawrence** (221 matches with 14 goals between 2007 and 2019). They are the only father/son combination where both have over 200 appearances – and most remarkably, both being captains.

The only father known to have played in the same match as his son is **Barry Lewis** (211 matches with 18 goals and an unknown number of red cards between 1995 and 2014). Barry was in the starting line-up when his 15 year old son **Clayton Lewis** (41 matches with 9 goals between 2012 and 2015) came off the bench in a 4-0 cup win at Wainuiomata giving rise to that amusing cry of "pass the ball dad" during the match. They started 15 games together, one of which at Endeavour Park against Western Suburbs resulted in a red card for Barry after he took matters into his own hands when he felt that the referee was not protecting Clayton enough. Clayton would go on to play for the All Whites and the Wellington Phoenix.

Chas Lawrence and Clayton Lewis are half-brothers and played together in 40 of Clayton's 41 appearances (26 starts in the 40 matches). It is assumed by everyone (including Chas) that Chas was most likely suspended for the game that Clayton played without Chas (the agonising 3-3 draw with Upper Hutt City in 2013). In the 8-1 thrashing of Wairarapa United in August 2013 Chas hit a hattrick while Clayton netted twice – so five goals between them which is the most by any relations in a single match. Chas and Barry started 92 matches together while all three played in 23 matches together.

The Christie-Yiavasis family were well represented in the 1970s. Two sets of brothers Jim Christie-Yiavasis (1 match in 1972) and his brother Costa Christie (1 match in 1976) and their cousins, brothers Andrew Yiavasis (70 matches with 8 goals between 1970 and 1979) and Luke Yiavasis (18 matches between 1972 and 1975). Andrew and Luke started 2 matches together while Andrew was in the starting line-up when Jim made his only appearance from the bench. Andrew played his last match in June 1979 coming off the bench against in a 0-1 loss to Hungaria only a week before Jim's son Chris Christie-Yiavasis (257 matches with 103 goals between 1979 and 2002) made his debut off the bench in a 1-5 thumping by Wanganui Athletic. Chris would become only the second player after Harry Kotsapas to reach 100 goals for the first team (later matched by Gianni Bouzoukis). Jim was inducted into the Wellington Olympic Hall of Fame in 2020.

Another multi-generational family are the Ashbys -Christian Ashby (1 match in 1996) and Peter Ashby (2 matches between 1997 and 1998). Their nephew **Stefan** Ashby (4 matches with 1 goal in 2024) also played.

## There are a few examples of father and son only combinations

- Jack Nathu (25 matches in 1984) and Sacha Nathu (31 matches between 2008 and 2011) became the first father and son goalkeepers to play for the first team. Jack had played internationally for the All Whites in the Merdeka Cup while Sacha still plays for Olympic for the third team in Capital 1.
- John Serepisos (that infamous one match in 2008) and his son Thomas Serepisos (7 matches between 2015 and 2017). John, former President/Chairman, is better known for his behind-the-scenes activities and was inducted into the Wellington Olympic Hall of Fame in 2023.
- Basil Mitrakas (201 matches with 19 goals between 1988 and 2002) and his son Samuel Mitrakas (69 matches with 3 goals between 2017 and 2024).
- Basil Bouzoukis (151 matches with 6 goals between 1978 and 1991) and his son Gianni Bouzoukis (150 matches with 114 goals between 2016 and 2024).
  Gianni is twice winner of the National League Golden Boot (2022 and 2023) and now lies second on the alltime goal scoring chart for Olympic. His 100th goal for the club was in a 5-2 win against Christchurch United in 2023 and was brought up in only 127 matches. Basil went on to become joint chairman with Paul Kotrotsos.



## There are only a few instances where three brothers all played for the first team

- Ian Cave (104 matches with 2 goals between 1996 and 2002), Neal Cave (15 matches with 9 goals in 1997) and Matthew Cave (2 matches in 1997). Ian and Neal started 12 matches together but all three played in the 1997 1-0 win against Wellington United
  Matthew started while Ian and Neal came off the bench. It is not known whether all three were on the pitch at the same time.
- Stelios Hatzilamprou (11 matches with 1 goal between 1996 and 2000), Kyriakos Hatzilamprou (13 matches between 2000 and 2001) and Mario Hatzilamprou (1 match in 2009). The only time any of the brothers played in the same match was in a 4-1 win against Tawa in 2000 when Stelios started and Kyriakos came off the bench.
- Brett Stephens (10 matches with 2 goals in 2004), Grant Stephens (2 matches between 2005 and 2010) and Craig Stephens (1 match in 2008).

## There are however plenty of instances of pairs of brothers only who played over the years

- Nigel Metcalf (82 matches between 1973 and 1978) and Roydon Metcalf (15 matches between 1975 and 1976). The brothers started 14 matches together and Roydon came off the bench in his only other appearance in a match that Nigel started. Nigel holds the unwanted record of most games played for the club without a goal – 17 more than anyone else.
- Brian Watson (6 matches in 1978) and Tony Watson (3 matches in 1978). Brian and Tony started in all 3 matches that Tony played with both making their debut in a 1-0 win against Lower Hutt City in May 1978.
- John Brydon (12 matches in 1983) and Paul Brydon (2 matches in 1991).
- Bobby Peel (32 matches with 6 goals between 1983 and 1989) and Mick Peel (136 matches with 7 goals between 1986 and 1994). Bobby and Mick started 21 matches together.
- Basil Vrizonis (91 matches with 1 goal between 1990 and 2002) and John Vrizonis (5 matches between 1992 and 1993). Basil and John started 3 matches together.
- Andre Racz (104 matches with 59 goals between 1991 and 1995) and Paul Racz (14 matches with 1 goal between 1993 and 1994). They started 8 matches together although not the 1994 Chatham Cup final which was Andre's 100th cap.
- Craig Candy (128 matches with 44 goals between 1993 and 1998) and Brent Candy (1 match in 1995).
  Brent's only appearance was off the bench in a 0-0 draw against Lower Hutt City in September 1995 in a match which Craig started.

- Steven Osborne (10 matches between 1996 and 2000) and Chris Osborne (5 matches between 1996 and 2000). Despite playing at the same time, they never played in the same match together.
- Rocky Rogan (25 matches between 1998 and 1999) and Trapper Rogan (2 matches in 1998). Both were starters when Trapper made his debut in a 2-4 loss to Lower Hutt City in August 1998.
- Jeff Sole (85 matches with 13 goals between 1999 and 2004) and Andy Sole (2 matches in 2000). Both Andy's appearances were off the bench in matches that Jeff started.
- David Ure (44 matches with 6 goals between 2000 and 2001) and Jody Ure (2 matches in 2000). Both brothers made their debut as starters in a 0-2 loss against Upper Hutt City in March 2000. They both played the following week (this time with Jody coming off the bench) but Jody never played for the first team again.
- Joe Lupi (14 matches with 6 goals in 2004) and Paul Lupi (8 matches with 1 goal in 2008).
- Blair Easthope (20 matches with 1 goal in 2005) and Shaun Easthope (43 matches with 3 goals between 2007 and 2009). Shaun also coached the first team in 2018 and 2019.
- George Barbarouses (95 matches with 19 between 2005 and 2021) and Kosta Barbarouses (24 matches with 15 goals between 2006 and 2007) started 9 matches together. George missed out on reaching the 100 caps after transferring to Wellington United for the 2020 season (before players had easy access to their stats) and currently plays for the third team having helped them win Capital 1 in 2022. Kosta, like Leo Bertos, also played over 100 times for the All Whites and is still notching up the goals for both.



- Anton De Gregorio (20 matches with 2 goals in 2007) and Raf De Gregorio (74 matches with 22 goals between 2007 and 2011). Anton and Raf made their debut in the 1-4 loss against Lower Hutt City in April 2007 (Anton started while Raf came off the bench). They became the second set of brothers to score in the same match when netting in a 3-1 win against Palmerston North Marist in August 2007. Raf played over 20 times for the All Whites and won the Jack Batty Memorial Cup in the 2009 Chatham Cup Final having scored the goal that won our first ever Chatham Cup in a 2-1 win against Three Kings United.
- Tapfuma Dimairo (17 matches in 2016) and Tamupiwa Dimairo (91 matches with 1 goal between 2019 and 2024). Tam's only goal came from the penalty spot in a 5-0 win against North Wellington in 2023.
- Levi McFarlane (13 matches in 2020) and Cruze McFarlane (1 match in 2020). Cruze's one appearance was from the bench in a 4-0 win at Petone and Levi also played in that match.
- Oliver Davies (6 matches with 2 goals between 2023 and 2024) and Alex Davies (1 match in 2025).

#### There are a couple of instances of uncles and nephews

- George Apostolakis (5 matches between 1985 and 1989) and his nephew Dimitri Apostolakis (4 matches between 2015 and 2019).
- Mark Attard (2 matches in 1992) and his nephew Charlie Attard (3 matches between 2014 and 2015).

With **Noah Boyce** and **Oscar Boyce** in our first team squad this season we will likely add another pairing to the list. It will probably be a while yet before we add to the existing families listed although seeing the youngsters with a ball at their feet on the sidelines gives us hope that it is just a matter of time.


