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FAQs:

Where is the Fall Retreat happening?

- Right here at LCF, Friday, October 28th to Sunday, October 30th.
- Friday evening will start with you meeting at Host Homes at 6pm to drop off luggage.

How much is it for the weekend?

- For regular attending LCF Students, the cost is \$50. If your student invites a friend, their cost is \$10. There is an online promo code they can put in for a \$40 discount while registering.
- Cost includes a t-shirt (designed by the Cory Thomason), help cover the cost of food/snacks, and a fun event on Saturday of the retreat.

When is registration due for the Fall Retreat?

- October 9th will give us the amount of time for families and friends to sign up and give us the best chance to know what numbers we are working with to plan accordingly!
- There will also be a chance to sign up one last time at our Parent/Camper Meeting on Wednesday, October 19th. More about that meeting is below.

What do students do with their luggage once the retreat starts?

- We will have students drop their luggage off at their host home first thing! This way at the end of the night, our drivers don't have to haul both students and luggage at the end of the night. This will make things much smoother starting out this way. Once you drop your student off at their host home (we will provide you with all the info and host home address you need), we will have volunteer (and vetted) drivers transport kids to LCF for the start of the retreat.

Will students be staying the night at Host Homes?

- Yes! We have some amazing (vetted and safe) adults/parents/volunteers who are ready to open their homes/basements and floor space so students can have an amazing weekend!
- Most of the host homes are of parents that have students in our ministry. We are still recruiting people to serve in this way so if your home would be conducive to this kind of thing, please let us know!
- Students will be in host homes with their grades and gender specifically. There will be no home with both boys and girls in the home.
- Students will be asked to bring sleeping bags or blankets to sleep on the floor. There will be no need for beds to be shared among students. DGroup Leaders may take an empty bedroom or couch (offered by the host home) all for themselves and will not share with a student.



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FAQs CONT.:

My student has work obligations or school obligations...can they leave and come back?

- Of course. Some things end up on the calendar way before we publicized this and certain obligations can't get moved around. We ask that you fill out a TIME AWAY FORM at our Parent/Camper Meeting to let us know when to expect you and where to best communicate where we will be during the time you need to pick them up.

Can my student drive back and forth to host homes if they are old enough and have their own vehicle?

- Once students drive to their host home, we ask that the car remain parked until the end of the weekend. If there is a moment they need to leave during the retreat, we will need to make sure you (parents) are aware so there isn't any students in our care leaving without us knowing about it.

Is there going to be a Parent/Camper Meeting so we can get all the information about Host Homes/Drivers/Schedules, etc?

- Yes! This will be important that you attend this with your student. In order for us to have a great weekend, we will all need to be on the same page as it pertains to what is expected and what you can expect from us. Put it on your calendar that we will have a Parent/Camper Meeting on Wednesday, October 19th from 6:30pm-7:30pm.
