**RE: Interest in Research Cooperation on Cannabis Driving Impairment**

Dr. Goldstein,

We were introduced to the planned Cannabis Research Center at North Andover's 1600 Osgood Street facility by our mutual colleague Hooks Johnston, CEO of Andover Medical Devices.

We understand that an important area of research interest by the Center would be the development of rapid testing device for measuring driving impairment caused by cannabis consumption. As you know, Rebion (formerly REBIScan) is a medical device start-up based in Boston that is exploring that very market. We have developed a neural performance scan for identifying brain dysfunction, and our first product has recently received FDA clearance for the eye conditions of amblyopia (lazy-eye) and strabismus (misaligned eyes).

As we explore additional uses for our technology, we believe there may be a practical application in identifying vision impairment due to substance abuse. We find this to be an important mission within the legalization of cannabis use. Given our conversations, along with the dialogue you have started with various other companies working on impairment detection, we believe you take this aspect of the industry equally seriously. A focused cooperative and collaborative effort could complement and accelerate your Center's planned research on rapid measurement of cannabis on driving impairment.

We would welcome the opportunity to be part of this research at your facility once it is established, and we support your efforts to obtain the required permits from the town of North Andover. We look forward to meeting with you to discuss our participation after the May 16<sup>th</sup> North Andover town meeting.
