- Able to commit to meeting over the 8-month program



How will individuals be selected?

The following criteria will be assessed when reviewing applications:

- Willingness to collaborate
- Openness to learning and sharing experiences
- Excitement about and investment in the program
- Commitment to the timeline and expectations
- Alignment with the program values and format
- Representation from a variety of organization types



What are the expectations for participation?

- Estimated 24 hours of participation over 8 months with participants compensated for this time
- Present on an adaptation project (e.g., PPT, video, article, podcast) with potential for collaboration
- Participate in pre- and post-evaluations
- Share expertise and lead community building exercises (optional)
