Aaron Taylor Kuffner



New York based conceptual artist Aaron Taylor Kuffner immersed himself in the art of Indonesian gamelan during his time living in Java and Bali. Over the last decade Kuffner has dedicated himself to a series of sonic kinetic sculptures that preserve and reinterpret this ancient tradition by retrofitting augmented hand forged gamelan instruments with mechanical mallets that robotically playback his original compositions by way of a proprietary physical computing network. He calls the artworks Gamelatrons.

Kuffner is a trained painter and metal sculptor, a former street artist, theatre director, international DJ and music producer. Kuffner studied at the Institut Seni Inodenesia Yogyakarta, where he embraced the traditions of both the gamelan and village life. Dedicated to expanding the legacy and creative cultural power of Gamelan through innovation, Kuffner's viscerally powerful installation, site-specific performances strives to create a harmony in the tension of fusing the East and the West, the Modern and the Ancient.

Kuffner has performed and exhibited work more than 400 times in 22 countries in the last eighteen years. He has created more than twenty Gamelatron sculptures in the last seven years. His recent installations have been exhibited by the Hammer Museum in Los Angeles, California (2017); the Drawing Center, New York (2016); 56th Venice Biennale at the Palazzo Grimani Museum Venice (2015); The Sackler Gallery at the Smithsonian Institute, Washington D.C. (2013); and The Clocktower Gallery, New York (2012). He also received grants, in-kind supports and awards from the Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts in association with the Clocktower Gallery, New York; The trust for Mutual Understanding; The Experimental Television Center; The New York Council for the Arts; Ableton Gmhb; The CEC Artslink; Scope Arts; Artist Wanted; Techshop; The New Orleans Airlift; The Indonesian Foreign Ministry; The Dharmasiswa Scholarship; The Berlin Arts Council; The European Commission; I-D Media Berlin; Schloss Brollin Art Labor; The Black Rocks Arts Foundation; The James F. Robison Foundation; The Soros Foundation; Swiss Air; The Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation; the US Artists International partnership with the National Endowment for the Arts; and the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation.

Kuffner has also been commissioned by the Renwick Gallery at the Smithsonian Institute to install a new artwork opening to the public in March 2018.

Gamelatron: Sonic Kinetic Sculptures, is Kuffner's first at Crossing Collective, and explores his ongoing dialogue with the emerging field of robotics in which sonic sculptures expose us to the rich and profound nature of resonance and its effect on the psyche.

Each Gamelatron is its own orchestra, and draws upon Indonesia's thousand-year-old tradition of gamelan ensembles. These handcrafted, masterfully-tuned orchestras of vibraphones, drums, chimes, bells, and resonating bronze gongs played by robotic mallets are installed to immerse the observer in living kinetic sculptures. Compositions range from solitary reverberations of massive gongs and singing chimes to full ritual or storytelling orchestrations. Kuffner uses exhibitions of these Gamelatrons to create sanctuaries both in public and private spaces and views the body of the work as an offering to the observer.

The exhibition, which includes over thirteen different types of Gamelatrons, including six new works by Kuffner that have never been seen before, will begin on January 18, 2018. Gallery hours are Tuesday—Saturday 10am—6pm. Body Phones, 2017

Single Tone Mindfulness Sculptures are a series of sound producing artworks that focus on a single resonance from an acoustic source. Artworks are named for the size of the wave lengths the acoustic source produces recorded in Hertz. Single Tone Mindfulness Sculptures are rooted in interactive conceptual rules geared towards increasing mindfulness and awareness of self and surrounding. Pieces often have a programable countdown timer which triggers the sound to play. The user is asked to set an intention when they set the timer and to use the resonance as a reminder of the intention they set. Other artworks in the series use sets of celestial data to trigger the resonance through the day in an effort to draw a connection with larger celestial bodies.





Ku ffner's mission is to bring the legacy and creative cultural power of the gamelatron to new shores, new people and communities to create an intimate experience with acoustic resonance. The essence of the Gamelatron is in the live experience.

The instruments, robotic mechanisms, and sculptural mounting systems are all handmade. The Instruments are usually made from copper and tin, forged into shape and tune. All compositions are written and performed by Aaron Taylor Kuffner. Scores are unique for every gamelatron set and are often site responsive composed after installation.
