



The Domestic Violence program provides a trained, multi-disciplinary team that works with law enforcement, other tribal agencies, and state agencies that receive DV/SA referrals of tribal members. This allows us to manage any issues the program may face while working to better serve Native Americans in the service area as well as tribal members in the state of Oklahoma.





»Victim Advocacy«

Confidential advocacy for survivors of sexual assault, sex trafficking, domestic violence, stalking, and dating violence, including 24hrs/7days a week crisis intervention and support. Each survivor will receive emotional support and resources both to Tribal programs and local community programs. Advocacy can be provided at hospitals, police stations, throughout the legal system and in the community. The program also serves as a resource center to the community by offering educational information and referrals as needed.

»Court Advocacy«

Helps assist survivors who are in need of filing an emergency protective order as well as assist the survivor with ongoing Domestic violence related court appearances.

»Housing and Utility« Assistance

Assistance can be provided to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, sex trafficking, dating violence or stalking. Any assistance is based on availability of funding and a demonstrated need. To qualify for assistance you must complete an intake and meet with an advocate to determine eligibility.



»Referral Assistance «

Assists with providing community resources to those who are in need of services that the Absentee Shawnee Tribe Domestic Violence Program does not provide.

»Shelter Placement« Assistance

The AST DV program advocates provide assistance in locating emergency housing/shelter for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, sex trafficking, dating violence, or stalking. The AST DV program collaborates with domestic violence shelters in Oklahoma to offer safe housing options. If you are in need of emergency shelter you may contact our office for assistance and a list of local domestic violence shelters.

»Community Outreach«

The AST DV staff participates in community events to provide awareness to Tribal and non-Tribal communities regarding our program and the services we provide to those who experience domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence and stalking incidents.



WHAT TO DO IF SEXUALLY ASSAULTED...

- Go to a safe area
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible
- A sexual assault nurse exam can be performed (up to 120 hours after the assault) to collect evidence

- Know it is NOT your fault

OTAP is a 52-week program providing a cognitive behavioral approach with an emphasis on culture, history and Native American traditions.







TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Iowa Tribe's Tribal Government Program serves adult and adolescent victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, teen dating violence, and stalking. The program will assist Native and Non-Native individuals in Payne, Logan, and Lincoln County. Services are provided in the following areas:

- Finding safe living arrangements (locating and renting safe, stable housing)
- Life skills training such as budgeting and housekeeping
- C— Employability skills training to prepare for, obtain and maintain employment including interviewing techniques, resume writing, job search planning, and social skills on the job
- C—

 Exploration and encouragement of educational, vocational and post-secondary opportunities
- Oma Interpersonal skill building, goal setting and conflict resolution
- Oma Information on available services within the community
- Referrals for any necessary mental and/or physical health treatment
- O─m Substance abuse prevention information

SERVICES OFFERED

Each service area within the Transitional Housing Program has unique criteria for eligibility and services offered may vary. All persons presenting as a survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, teen dating violence, and stalking can be eligible for services at no cost to them. Each person will be required to fill out an intake to determine their eligibility for the transitional housing program.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Any individual who is a survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, teen dating violence, and stalking can be eligible for services.

RESTRICTIONS AND POLICIES

- ○--- No contact with abuser
- ○─m No roommates unless approved
- ○----- Communication mandatory with advocate at least twice monthly
- Participants must have or be seeking reliable employment
- C—Individual financial assistance is limited to 6 months, although case management and support may be available beyond that time.



Crisis Line Procedures

When we answer the Crisis Line, we simply say "Hello" for your safey. The operator will not identify the line as a Family Volence Crisis Line. If you ask the operator if you have called the crisis line, she will reply with "May I help you?" This is to prevent abusers from checking your call log to find out if the call has been placed, which could put you in danger.

If our Crisis Operator is on the line with another crisis call you will receive a call back if you leave a message stating it is safe to call back. Please be advised that for security reasons, the number appearing on your caller I.D. will be different than the crisis line number you called.

If you are unable to speak without being heard by your abuser, please feel free to text us. Again, let us know that it is safe to text you back. We have no way of knowing if your abuser is monitoring your phone.





WHAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic violence (or family violence) is an abusive, violent, forceful or threatening act against another person with whom the perpetrator has an intimate relationship. Domestic violence may take the form of physical violence or assault but may also be verbal abuse, emotional abuse, financial abuse (controlling funds), sexual abuse or stalking.

Domestic violence may also be described as a pattern of behavior in which one person in the relationship attempts to gain power over his or her partner through fear, intimidation and abuse.

Some examples of domestic violence are:

- Extreme jealousy, insecurity or possessiveness
- Explosive temper or mood swings
- Isolation from family and friends
- Put-downs, false accusations or possessiveness

HOW YOU CAN GET HELP

If you think you or a friend may be in an abusive relationship, or have recently fled an abusive relationship, talk to an advocate. Don't be afraid to get help.

Call 1-800-522-6170 to speak to a Family Violence Prevention social worker. Family Violence Prevention workers are located throughout the Choctaw Nation Reservation.

Do you qualify for assistance?

- Current or recent survivor of intimate partner domestic violence (intimate partner is defined as spouse, significant other or partner)
- Resides within the Choctaw Nation Reservation
- Services are available to Non-Native American victims as well as Native American victims (not required to be Native American)
- Services available regardless of race, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity (or expression), religion, national origin, age, disability, as well as to others from diverse backgrounds







Domestic Violence is a pattern of abusive behaviors used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another partner in an intimate relationship. Domestic it can be Sexual Abuse, Emotional Abuse, Verbal Abuse, Financial Abuse, Social Abuse and more.

WHAT IS SEXUAL ASSAULT?

It is any type of sexual activity or contact that was forced or that you did not consent to. It can happen with strangers, friends and committed partners.

WHAT IS STALKING?

It is unwanted or repeated surveillance by an individual or group towards another person. Stalking behaviors are interrelated to harassment and intimidation and may include following the victim or monitoring the victim.


