

13 NORFOLK

Distance: 10 miles/16km Time: 5 hours Grade: Moderate







CHOSEN BY... PHOEBE TAPLIN This classic Norfolk ramble starts in

landscaped Holkham Park and ends on the pine-fringed beaches nearby. Victorian poet Algernon Swinburne called them "wide sands where the sea draws breath". In between, loop past woods, farmland, salt marshes purple with sea lavender, sand dunes and a village pub at Burnham Overy Staithe. People wanting to explore more of Holkham Park (or looking for shorter routes) can follow waymarked trails around the estate.

Start

From Lady Anne's Drive, cross A149 and walk straight up

Park Road. Continue along wide avenue of holm oaks. Go through North Gates into Holkham Park and turn immediately R along stony track. Fork L on grassy path, following red arrow, towards Coke Monument. Turn L before monument and head through deer park towards lake.

1 mile/1.6km

Reaching lake, turn L along bank with water on R. Near Holkham Hall, head R to continue around lake. Where water ends, keep straight through gate signed Walled Garden. Continue through wrought iron gate near garden, turn L on surfaced drive and R on another drive across open farmland. Immediately after



Wells-next-the-Sea Refreshments Cafés and kiosks in Holkham Park, The Hero pub in Burnham Overy Staithe (thehero burnhamovery.co.uk; 01328 738334), Lookout Café at end (holkham.co. uk/stay-eat/the-lookout). Public toilets in Holkham

near start, Lookout at end **Public transport**

Hourly bus 36 (Lynx) from King's Lynn to Wells

stops very near start **Maps** OS Explorer 251; Landranger 132







West Lodge House, turn sharp L onto grassy track beside woods and flint wall (former Roman road).

3 miles/5km
After ½ mile, turn R down unmarked grassy track towards barn with red-tiled roof below. Keep straight for 1 mile on concrete track, passing silo. Cross lane and continue on bridleway ahead, curving past church in valley below. At junction with lane near church, turn R through little kissing gate into field. Follow path along edge of field, over stile, and diagonally L across next field towards line of trees

4¾ miles/7.6km
Go through kissing gate and turn L along embankment (disused railway). After 100m, turn R following waymark down bank, out of trees and R along edge of field. Follow path L. Turn R along B1155 for 150m and L after last house onto sandy track with footpath sign. Continue straight up main track ahead and on down Gong Lane into Burnham Overy Staithe.

6 miles/9.7km
Cross main road near
pub and keep on along
East Harbour Way. Turn
R immediately after black
house at end and walk along
bank above car park. Go
through gate at end and turn
L onto Coast Path, signed
Holkham Gap. Follow orange



sandy path on embankment near Overy Creek for ¾ mile. Continue along clear path as it winds between salt and grazing marshes through Holkham Nature Reserve.

67½ miles/12km
Follow the boardwalk
through sand dunes. When
the boards end, turn R between
two lines of dunes. Eventually,
a rough path leads gently L
towards the beach. For the
next 2 miles, keep sea on L
and walk along beach or
through dunes or under
shady pine trees.

79¾ miles/15.7km

Routes converge at
Holkham Gap, near band of
pines at right angles to sea.
(If walking on beach, dunes
and trees ahead are your cue
to start heading inland). Turn
R along boardwalk near pines,
back to Lady Anne's Drive.
