Distance: 7¼ miles/11.6km Time: 4½ hours Grade: Challenging







CHOSEN BY... LEN BANISTER The ascent of Snowdon via the

Rhyd-Ddu path is perhaps the most rewarding route to the top. Although not the easiest way to reach Wales' highest peak (it's quite some ascent from the valley), it has two great advantages; it's far less busy than most other paths and reveals a side to Snowdon few see. The jaw-dropping views along Snowdon's south ridge lead on to the amazing summit panorama, and by combining the Rhyd-Ddu Path with the Ranger Path on the way down, you have a great circular walk. A journey on the Welsh Highland Railway links the start and finish of the loop.

Start

750m high.

Start from far end of Rhyd-Ddu car park, cross track; begin walking east uphill. Go R at fork. After three gates reach junction.

21 mile/1.6km
Go L through the gate
northeast. Continue through
two more gates, go L at yellow
marker. From now on, look for
cairns to guide you. Go through
another gate, straight on uphill.
The next gate is at about

32½ miles/3.9km Go through, curving L along the Llechog spur to join the south ridge of Snowdon. Weather permitting, you should have good views of the





top. Go L along fenced path, climbing north-northeast along Snowdon's exposed south ridge towards the summit and mountain-top station/café.

4 3½ miles/5.6km
Descending from the summit, continue north following the track down, parallel with the railway.
Continue to rock block signing Snowdon Ranger Path and go L on a vague path, crossing the railway line to follow a clear, zigzagging cairn-marked path west over the Clogwyn Du'r Arddu spur. After about 3km

you'll reach a surprisingly elegant metal gate.

5¾ miles/9.1km
Continue downhill
following the Snowdon Ranger
Path. If you've parked at Rhyd
-Ddu and aren't catching the
Welsh Highland Railway from
the Snowdon Ranger, you can
fork off at a ladder-stile L (just
before leaving Access Land)
and follow the path to the start
at Rhyd-Ddu (an extra two
miles). Otherwise, keep forward
through gate, ignoring all paths
to Llanberis. After zigzag path,
go through gate downhill. After

next gate, go L then L after cattle grid to station where you can catch a train back to the start (remember that the Snowdon Ranger Station is a request stop).





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
