We will learn and discuss things like fairness, communication, when we need time to ourselves, respect, empathy, kindness, honesty, courage, perseverance, and more.

Social Emotional Skills

In building a safe, supportive and respectful environment our goal is to instill a strong sense of social emotional skills and social justice. This will include learning about differences, learning how to resolve conflict, learning how to recognize and self regulate emotions, stress management, how to respect each other's bodies and personalities, and learning how to read a situation and know what to do. This portion will focus on creating a strong community built off respect, compassion, kindness, and empathy.

Co-Teacher

Job Description & Responsibilities

The Co-Teacher will be the second head teacher alongside Ms. Allison. They will work together with Allison to create lesson plans that build character, friendship and teach social justice values like diversity, community, empathy and respect. The Co-Teacher will be responsible for leading group activities, discussing age appropriate topics with the children, helping plan and execute lessons and activities, while overseeing the program as a whole with Ms. Allison. The co-teacher will assist in emails, updates, and communication between teachers and parents. The responsibilities of the co-teacher may or may not include and are not limited to; leading activities and lessons, preparing snack, helping to maintain a clean facility, lesson planning, maintaining open communication between teachers and parents, setting healthy boundaries for the children, parents and teachers to depend on, and enforcing set protocols to ensure consistency and trust. The co-teacher must be passionate about teaching and find a love of learning alongside her students.

Assistant

Job Description & Responsibilities

The assistant will work alongside both head teachers to ensure an extra set of hands and eyes. They will be responsible for assisting children during group activities and lessons, helping to maintain a positive learning environment by encouraging participation or facilitating a safe space for any children who need extra time to themselves. The assistant duties may or may not include and are not limited to; preparing snack, assisting children to the restroom, with their lunches, their projects, activities, assisting teachers set up activities and projects, and reinforce protocols and boundaries to maintain a safe and positive learning environment.

Volunteers, Workshops + Special Interest

If you are interested in volunteering or offering a workshop or class during our summer camp we require you to have at least two years experience with children and to sign a release liability waiver and contract with The Handpicked Education.

Parents who would like to volunteer in class may do so as long as we do not have too many parents or volunteers at one time.
Children who are not part of the program will not be able to participate as the activities will be geared specifically for certain age groups. We ask that while volunteering, younger siblings have outside care unless an infant under 1 year.

If you would like to do something special with our summer camp kids like teach yoga, plan a party, plan an activity or craft, host a show and tell of animals, share resources, lend a hand in the garden, donate seeds or garden beds, host a music lesson, donate materials, host a fundraiser, we welcome opportunities for our community to get involved.
