REGATHERING UPDATE: We have released a new update to our regathering policies available at ssumc.org/worship. Based on new CDC guidance we are requiring universal masking while indoors. Thank you for loving your neighbor!

WELCOME BACK, LITTLE ONES: Today we resumed nursery care and children's church during Sunday morning worship! Nursery care is available for children ages 3 months through 3 years old, and children's church welcomes children ages 4-10 years old. There is a new check-in system for children's church that adults in the narthex.
