# KALEIDOSCOPE

*Kaleidoscope is a non-profit organization that provides third-culture kids (TCKs) with training, debriefing, and spiritual development within your conference structure. Our TCK-centered curriculum is taught by young adults who have a personal understanding of cross-cultural living. This program is a valuable investment in the lives of your third-culture kids.*

## KALEIDOSCOPE PARTICIPANTS

*The Kaleidoscope curriculum begins at age four. We recommend providing a childcare team for ages 0-3 that is separate from Kaleidoscope.*

### W o m p l e s

Ages 4-6

The Kaleidoscope curriculum will include Bible lessons, correlating crafts, third-culture kid awareness, group games, applicable science experiments and optional snacks.

Kaleidoscope will provide one worker for every two children, along with all supplies needed.

### W a y s

Ages 7-9

The Kaleidoscope curriculum covers third-culture kid training and debriefing, relevant Bible lessons, cultural understanding, crafts, group games and small group times.

Kaleidoscope will provide two leaders for this group, along with all supplies needed.

\*The WOMPLES and WAYS may be combined if either group has less than five kids.

### Y o k o s

Ages 10-12

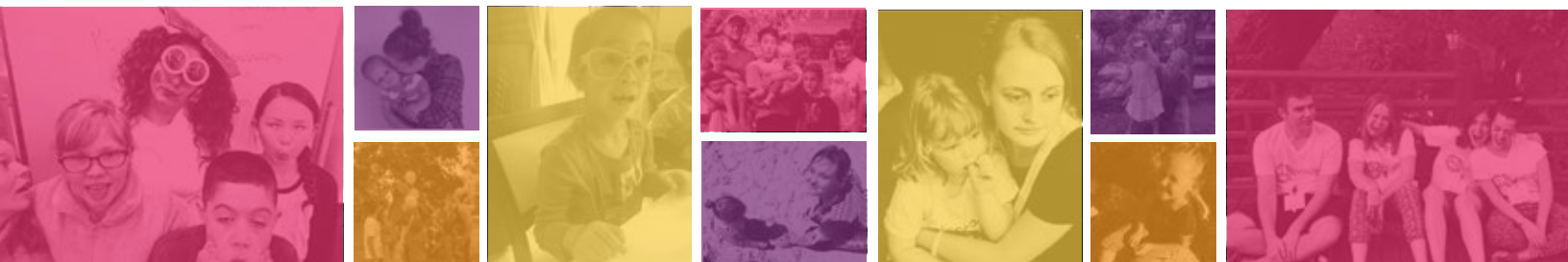

### N o v a s

Ages 13-18

Kaleidoscope will emphasize third-culture kid identity, training and debriefing, our true identity in Christ, and our place in the Great Commission. The YOKOS program relies on development of relationship and shared experiences. This will include small group time and one-on-one mentoring. Kaleidoscope commits to providing two leaders with third-culture kid background.

*Kaleidoscope is not responsible for overnight care or any program that starts before 8:00 or runs past 23:00. Kaleidoscope is not responsible for children during mealtimes, as well as scheduled group breaks or any days off unless otherwise specified.*



# HOUSING

The Kaleidoscope team should be housed together in comfortable and quiet facilities. Two to three team members of the same gender in one room is acceptable. Married couples should have their own room.

The Kaleidoscope team will arrive at the conference location two to three days prior to the start of the conference for training and preparation. Housing and food would need to be provided for these days along with one day and night post-conference for debriefing. Arrangements may be made by your team or by ours, with the understanding that any additional costs for room and board for a total of four days and nights will be covered by the partnering organization.

## CLASSROOM ACCOMODATIONS

Kaleidoscope requires one "classroom" per age group. The rooms should be large enough to comfortably accommodate each group, have good ventilation, and an air conditioner/fan or heating, as needed. The rooms do not require a lock, but need to remain set up day to day and should be safe to store craft and game supplies.

Please provide tables, chairs, and any other large equipment that may be needed, according to ages and parental specifications.

## FOOD

The Kaleidoscope team requires three meals a day for the duration of the conference. If food is not provided by the conference center, please include a food stipend that is on par with local prices, at your discretion. Likewise, food or a food stipend should be provided for the pre-conference training as well as the debrief day following the conference.

Kaleidoscope will provide daily snacks and/or a variety of international treats for the TCK program upon request.

## PRICING

### You Pay

Security Deposit = \$500 (fully refundable up to 4 months before scheduled conference and applied towards total cost)

Food, housing and on ground transportation for all Kaleidoscope team members = approximately \$3,000\*

Travel costs for a Kaleidoscope Conference Coordinator = up to \$1,500

Conference supplies and snacks = \$12 per day/per child
