Director's Letter

Dear Friend,

Every Friday, residents and staff gather at Samaritan Village's Stage I safe home for Family Meeting. This time is a space for the resident survivors to check-in and connect with openness and honesty. Residents are encouraged to share what is on their hearts and minds. Recently, one of the newer Samaritan Village residents shared, **"I prayed for three years for a place exactly like this. And now I'm here."**

These are the moments that remind our team why the ministry of Samaritan Village matters. A woman prayed with faith and hope, even in the midst of great darkness. Little did she know that God was answering her prayer right then – preparing her for a fresh future and Samaritan Village to be ready for her arrival.

As I reflect upon the many ways God has worked throughout those three years, I am drawn to the picture of a seed sown in winter. Although we only see the surface of bare earth and gray skies, a network of roots spirals from that seed, drawing in nourishment, growing strong. And then...spring arrives.

Today, Samaritan Village is rooted in purpose and thriving with an outburst of renewed life. Here are just a few of those signs of growth:

- Developed and adopted a three stage model of rehabilitation and support
- Opened an independent living safe home for survivors in advanced stages of healing
- Added therapeutic services such as equine therapy, EMDR and art therapy
- Served 39 women in the last three years

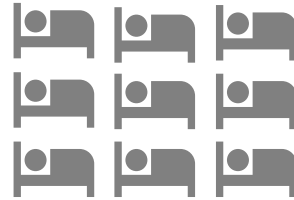

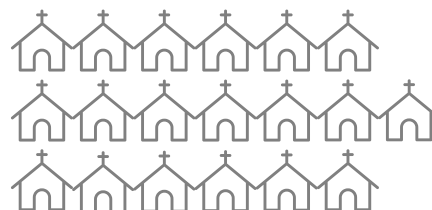

Thrive in Body, Mind, & Soul

Through Samaritan Village's three-stage model of rehabilitation and healing, survivors can now receive support and resources for up to five years. Plus, the relationships that blossom during their time at the Village, often carry beyond the program. Going deep means that lasting transformation is a matter of the body, mind, and soul.

It's about holistic care.

Survivors are accomplishing their treatment goals at an accelerated rate of success. Day by day, they rebuild trust, nurture connections, confront trauma, and acquire the life skills that will bear fruit for years to come.

EXPANSION CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Late in 2019, Samaritan Village launched the Expansion Plan Capital Campaign. The purpose of this project has been to establish a 12-month transitional living safe house. In this home, survivors who have completed an initial recovery phase (such as Samaritan Village's Stage I Safe Home) will establish enduring community and gain confidence in their recovery, life skills, and readiness to live independent lives.

As of November 2022, this project is FULLY FUNDED!

THE EN GEDI STORY

Named for the oasis where David found refuge in 1 Samuel, the En Gedi Independent Living Home came to Samaritan Village as an unexpected gift. When one family heard that Samaritan Village wanted to open a new home for survivors of sex trafficking, they recognized an answer to their prayer – that one day they would be able to bless someone by giving away a house. They donated their beautiful townhome to become just such a refuge for survivors. Because of such radical generosity, En Gedi now offers an affordable living option for Stage III survivors who are well on their way to full recovery and healthy independence.

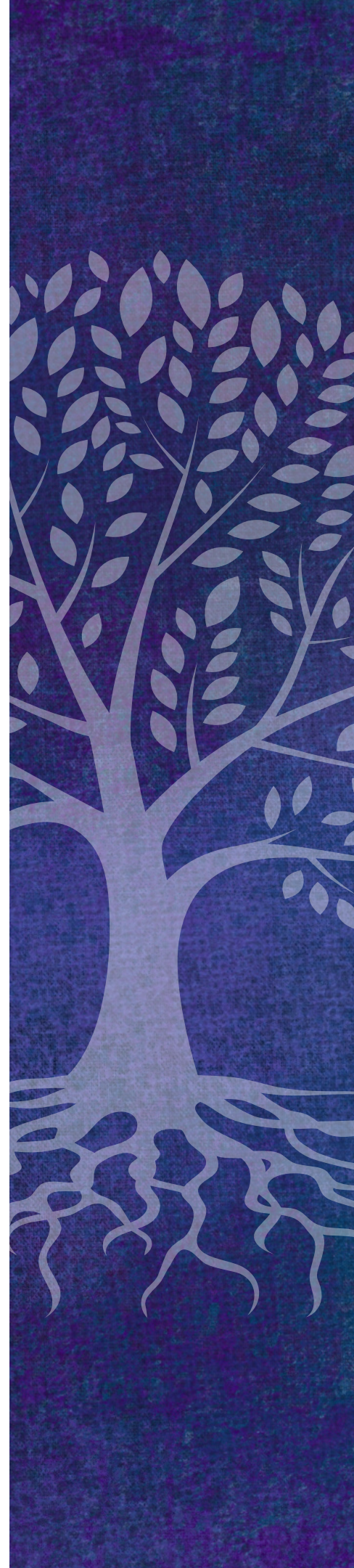

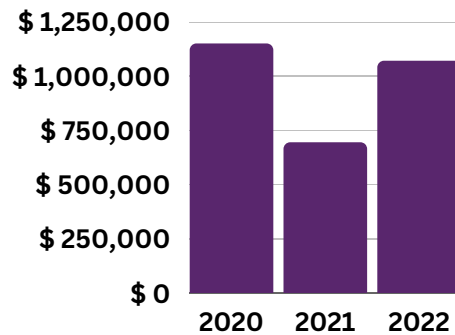

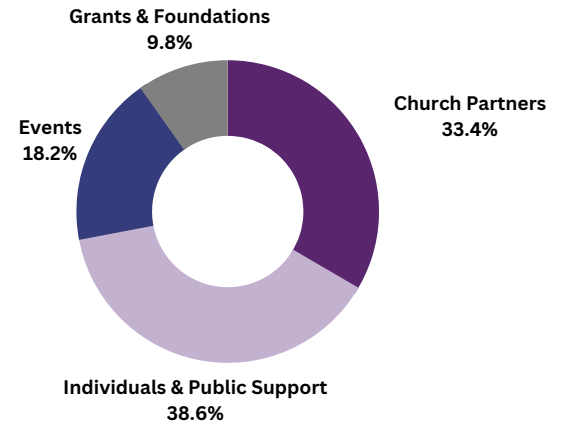

GIVING BY GROUP



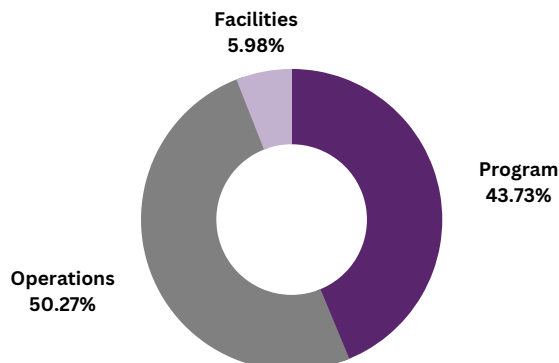
