2024 EXHIBITIONS

EXHIBITIONS 2024: May 4 - June 2

NATALIE EDGAR: 1970s Paintings

Natalie Edgar's 1970s paintings were created a mere stone's throw from the gallery at Duck Creek. In this series, Natalie Edgar expanded the Abstract Expressionist tradition with a distinctive approach to color, texture, and surface. By exploring the dynamic interplay of recessive and projective elements, she broke free from the confines of a single plane, creating a scatter-like effect that redefined two-dimensional art.



FRANCISCO CABRERA: (Chemical) Paradise

Francisco "Mijo" Cabrera began this work in 2015 when he discovered an exciting and responsive new medium in thermal receipt paper. In a convergence of surrealism and abstract expressionism, the artist employs unorthodox substances applied to woven thermal receipt paper to conjure fantastical worlds out of chemical reactions.



EXHIBITIONS 2024: June 8 - July 7

ALLISON GILDERSLEEVE: Breathing Underwater

Through a series of visual contradictions, Brooklyn-based artist Allison Gildersleeve's seemingly familiar environments jettison the natural order of things in favor of a space that uses memory as guide. In this show, landscapes and interiors painted in high key color and thick gesture are offset by silhouetted forms of disproportionate scale.



KAREN MAY: Artforum Interventions

Through her drawings on Artforum advertisements, developmentally disabled artist Karen May offers spontaneous responses, reactions, and redactions to images of contemporary art. By liberating these ads from their original context, May prompts us to consider a creative process that is freed from a commerce-driven culture.


ALL THE THINGS Curated by Erika Ranee

All the Things features works by Daniel John Gadd, Carl E. Hazlewood, Leeza Meksin, Nickola Pottinger, Jeanne Reynal, and Rachel Eulena Williams. These six artists defy the conventions of traditional painting by adeptly blurring the boundaries between "support" and "surface," while integrating diverse materials, rather than relying solely on paint.



ERIKA RANEE Feelings

Using a range of materials and techniques, Erika Ranee captures the beauty in the banal and elevates the textures of everyday life. Through complex layers of built and redacted colors and textures, her works reflect a dynamic interplay of form and movement influenced by the forces of gravity and entropy.



EXHIBITIONS 2024: August 31 - Sept 29


JONATHAN SHLAFER Assembly Theory

This Amagansett-based sculptor has spent the past few years crafting a distinctive exploration of forms influenced by the materials and natural scenery of the East End. With basic tools and unconventional methods, he works with salvaged wood, refining its natural shapes and unveiling the inherent textural beauty of its surface.



ELIZA LOU DOYLE & EM GALLAGHER Movers & Bathers

Movers & Bathers is a two-person exhibition of works in which both Doyle and Gallagher explore queer embodiment and physical interdependence through the use of their respective tools – collage, photography, and video. They have coined the term "queer entropy" to capture the idea of falling together, falling apart, and coming together again.



WINTER EXHIBITIONS 2024:

IAN L.C. SWORDY: Direct Carving at Duck Creek, December 1 - April 15.

Ian L.C. Swordy explores the physical and philosophical dimensions of carving, treating the process as both a form of live performance and a meditation on material transformation. Working primarily with marble, Swordy juxtaposes meticulously polished surfaces with raw textures and incorporates found objects to examine themes of permanence, imperfection, and artistry.



JEFF TRANCHELL: A-Side, January 25 - March 31

Jeffrey Tranchell's A-Side, is a glass and wood panel screen made specifically for the windows of the Art Center at Duck Creek. A site-specific winter exhibition in the windows of the John Little Barn at Historic Duck Creek Farm. The windows were on view from Dawn to Dusk, while the grounds are open to the public, optimal viewing at dusk.

2024 MUSIC SERIES

EMMANUEL MICHAEL GROUP: June 22

First-generation Ugandan and Southern Sudanese composer Emmanuel Michael is joined by close comrade Tim Watson for this concert. Together, they seek to search for truth and honesty within this intimate and vast sonic universe. showcasing Emmanuel's heartfelt compositions along the way.



RACHEL THERRIEN: July 11

Trumpeter Rachel Therrien is a highly innovative artist working at the crossroads of jazz and world music. The Latin Jazz Project is the fruit of her graduate studies at the Instituto Superior de Arte in Havana, her numerous musical experiences in Latin America and the Caribbean, and her 20 years of collaboration with the Latin jazz community in Montreal, New York and Toronto.



TOMOKI SANDERS: July 18

Multi-instrumentalist, producer & artist Tomoki Sanders brings a mix of vaporwave, fusion, jazz, & hip hop, combined with elements of digitally produced music. The child of the late saxophone legend Pharoah Sanders, Tomoki started playing drums at the age of 4, and studied performance and music production at Berklee College of Music.




JACKSON POLLOCK & JAZZ: July 25

Sponsored by the Pollock-Krasner House and Study Center, this was the first of two concerts focused on the record collection of Jackson Pollock and Lee Krasner. Organized in collaboration with The Jazz Loft in Stony Brook, NY, the concert featured original arrangements by Ray Anderson and Tom Manuel, inspired by the work of Jackson Pollock.




ARCOIRIS SANDOVAL SONIC ASYLUM: August 1

New York based jazz pianist and composer Arco Iris Sandoval leads her own trio and quintet project called Sonic Asylum. She will be joined by bassist Mimi Jones, who with Sandoval, co-directs the D.O.M.E. Experience, a multimedia orchestra which aims to raise environmental and social awareness through orchestra, choreography and cinematography.



J HOARD: August 8

J. Hoard's music interweaves genres to articulate his vivid songwriting. His eclectic approach has yielded songwriting collaborations with artists such as Black Coffee, Chance the Rapper, and Brasstracks, and jazz-experimental artists. No matter the genre, platform, or language, J. Hoard possesses the essence of the Black church and allure of the Great White Way.



LEE KRASNER & JAZZ: August 15


Sponsored by the Pollock-Krasner House and Study Center, this was the second of two concerts focused on the record collection of Jackson Pollock and Lee Krasner. Organized in collaboration with The Jazz Loft in Stony Brook, NY, the concert featured original arrangements by Dan Pugach, inspired by the work of Lee Krasner, and included vocals by Grammy Award-winning singer Nicole Zuraitis.



NEW JAZZ UNDERGROUND: September 7

New Jazz Underground has been described as "an innovative and ultra creative collective striving to establish themselves as a defining voice for the genre of Jazz and beyond." Their music signals a merging of traditional sensibilities in Jazz with the modern influence of swing, hip-hop, house/Afro-beat, and Afro-Cuban music.

Gian Carlo was raised on the East End, and received a degree in Songwriting and Composition at Berklee College of Music. He currently plays Sitar at Mandala Yoga, and performs with his band, Student Body.



NICK WEBER: Concert

Local artist and musician Nick Weber has called the East End home since 1995 and raised his family just down the road from Duck Creek. His Family Night concert featured a playful, interactive acoustic performance designed to captivate young audiences and inspire a love for music.



123 ANDRÉS

Andrés and Christina are the Latin Grammy-winning music duo 123 Andrés. Their catchy songs and lively concerts get the whole family dancing and learning, in Spanish and English.



SHINNECOCK PERSPECTIVES

Presented by The Boys and Girls Club of Shinnecock Nation, Shinnecock Perspectives aims to explore the intersection between Indigenous heritage and the dynamic young Shinnecock creative community exploring what Indigenous identity means today.



INDA EATON KIDS CONCERT

Inda Eaton lives for authentic adventures as a working musician. She is committed to sharing music with younger generations in school music programs with *Ideas to Inspire*, an organization that works to provide students with creative experiences through music, storytelling and self-expression.



GOAT ON A BOAT

Goat on a Boat Puppet Theater is committed to inspiring creativity in young audiences through the art of puppetry. They create, produce, and present live puppet shows and creative workshops and work to serve and collaborate with diverse audiences, artists, and community partners.



FLOR BROMLEY

Flor Bromley is a Latin GRAMMY® nominee singer/songwriter for families. Originally from Peru, she dedicates her life to creating music for kids that elevates our Latin culture, making it her mission to share her bilingual experience with a new generation.

Our YouTube channel has had 1.1 million views with 208,000 hours of watch time, while our website has logged over 30,000 views


