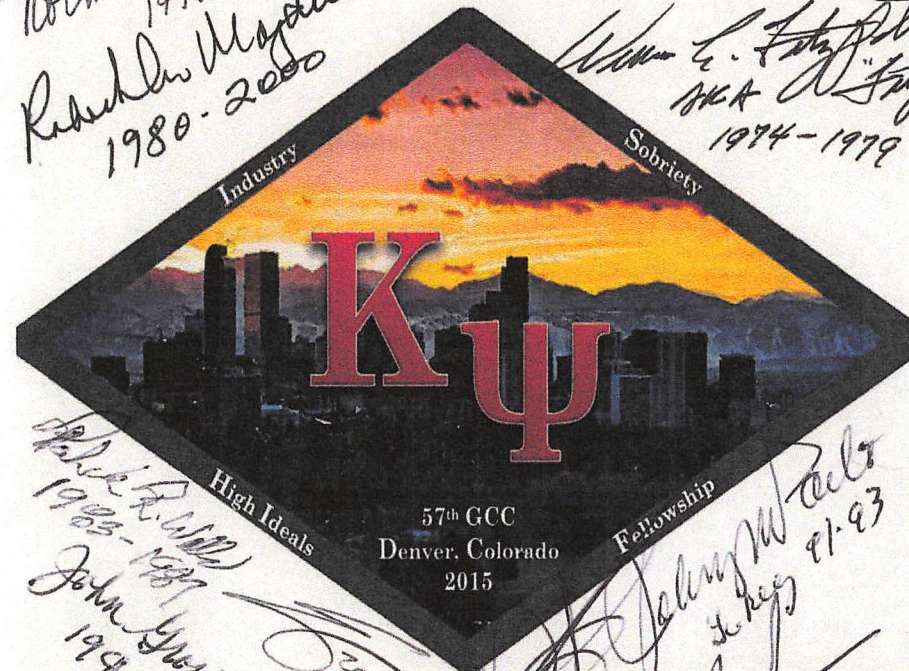

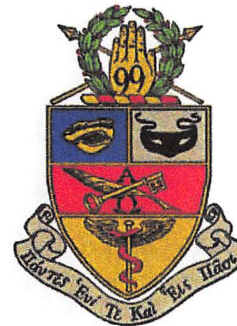

## House Rules

1. The seating of Delegates at all sessions of the Grand Council shall be in alphabetical order; Collegiate Chapters shall be seated first according to the Greek Alphabet; Graduate Chapters shall be seated next according to the English Alphabet; Provinces shall be seated next according to the English Alphabet. Random seating of Voting Delegates will not be permitted. Place cards shall be used to designate the assigned seat(s) for each Chapter and Province.
2. There shall be a roll call of Chapters, Provinces, and other voting members, attendance noted, and made a part of the report of the Grand Council, at the beginning of each session. No session of the Grand Council shall be opened unless a quorum is present. Absence from more than one (1) session of the Grand Council shall be a valid reason for possible reduction or elimination of travel reimbursement paid by the Fraternity to the Chapter.
3. All Officers and Members of the Executive Committee shall be present at all meetings of the Grand Council. Absence from more than one (1) session shall be a valid reason for possible reduction or elimination of travel reimbursement paid by the Fraternity. The only exception of this rule shall be when the member's presence is required at another function of the Grand Council which is coincidental with the meeting, or at the direction of the Grand Regent.
4. On any given debatable item, the total debate time shall be limited to twenty (20) minutes, with an additional ten (10) minutes to be allotted at the option of the Chairperson. Each side shall be allowed a maximum of ten (10) minutes unless additional time is allotted by the Chairperson. Each speaker shall be allowed a maximum of two (2) minutes, with an additional one (1) minute to be allotted at the option of the Chairperson. Speakers may proceed in any order; however, at the option of the Chairperson, debate may be made in alternating pro and con order. Time limits shall be kept by the Chairperson or his/her assigned agent.
5. Any member wishing to speak on an issue shall first seek the recognition of the Chairperson, after obtaining same, proceed to the assigned podium, and make his/her point. At all times during all meetings of the Grand Council, use of the floor shall be restricted to the business of the Grand Council, with proper dignity and decorum being maintained.

## House Rules Continued

6. There shall be NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES in the meeting room during sessions of the Grand Council.
7. At all times during all meetings, those in attendance shall be sober and properly dressed. PROFESSIONAL ATTIRE SHALL BE REQUIRED FOR ALL BUSINESS SESSIONS AND THE SCHOLARSHIP LUNCHEON. No member will be admitted to any meeting who is obviously intoxicated and/or who exhibits a bare chest and/or bare feet.
8. No photographs taken or videos made at any Grand Council Convention sessions may be sold without an official contract with the Fraternity.
9. There shall be no campaign materials permitted on the Grand Council Convention site or surrounding areas while the Grand Council Convention is in session.
10. Any Brother in attendance that is warned by hotel security for excessive noise or disturbing other hotel guests will be subject to removal by the hotel if a second warning is given. If the Brother, who is asked to leave, is a collegiate, the dean of their school/college will be notified of such occurrence. In addition, if the hotel comps a room for a hotel guest because of this errant activity, the Brother's Chapter shall be responsible for that cost and will be billed by The Central Office for this expense.
11. All cell phones and other electronic devices must be kept on silent during all sessions.
12. Mascots or props of any kind are prohibited at any Kappa Psi official function. Also the use of KΨ letters on such mascots or props is not acceptable as they do not appropriately reflect the professional image of Kappa Psi that the fraternity as a whole wants to project. Failure to follow any of the above rules may result, at the direction of the chairperson, in the member's removal from the meeting.
13. Failure to follow any of the above rules may result, at the direction of the chairperson, the member's removal from the meeting.
14. To suspend any or all of the above rules, either temporarily or permanently, shall require a three-fourths (¾) vote of the Members of the Grand Council.

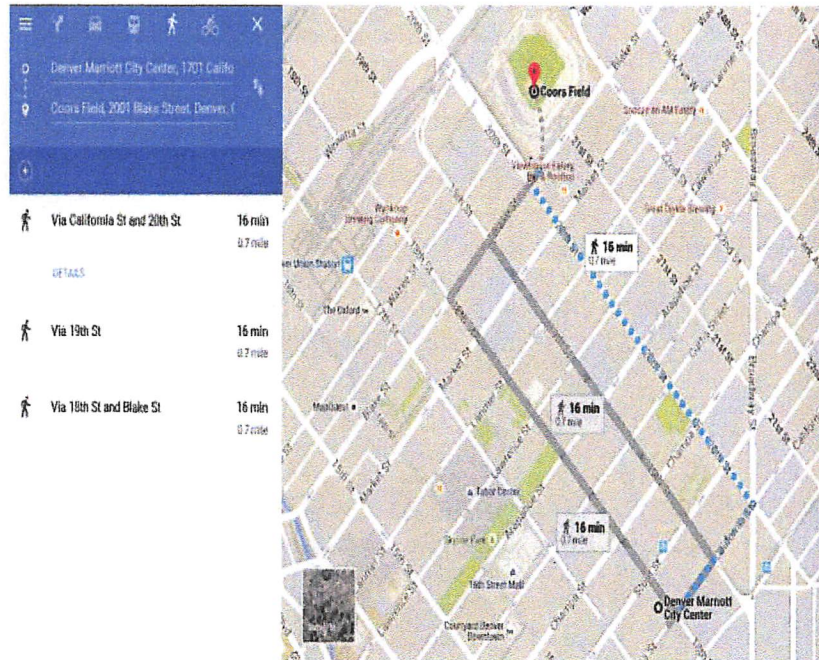


## Colorado Rockies versus Seattle Mariners

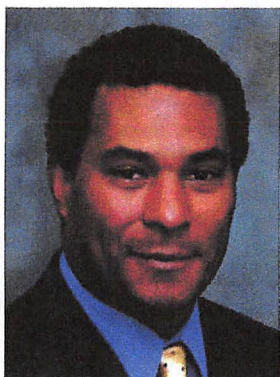
**Walking:** Please refer to the directions above. Denver blocks are shorter than most city blocks. It will take roughly 15-20 minutes to walk to the ballpark.

**Bus:** Another option is to take the complimentary 16<sup>th</sup> street bus. Walk 2 blocks over (from the Denver Marriott City Center – see above map) to 16<sup>th</sup> street to catch the bus. Buses stop every 1-2 minutes. Take the bus to Blake Street or Market Street, then walk 4 blocks east to 20<sup>th</sup> street.

**Taxi:** Taxi prices run an estimated \$5-7 depending on how many persons are in the vehicle and traffic.



## Keynote Speaker: Dr. Lawrence "LB" Brown



Dr. Lawrence "LB" Brown, is Associate Dean of Student Affairs, and Professor of Pharmacoeconomics and Health Policy at Chapman University School of Pharmacy. He completed his Doctor of Pharmacy degree at the University of the Pacific and his Ph.D. in Social and Administrative Pharmacy at the University of Minnesota. However, he began his career in pharmacy as a U.S. Air Force Pharmacy Technician from 1985 to 1991. His main research interests are: Economic and Clinical Outcomes of Pharmacists-Provided Medication Therapy Management (MTM) Services, and the Role of Pharmacists in the US and other Countries.

Dr. Brown has a rich history of experience in the Medication Therapy Management arena, and has a National and International reputation as an MTM expert. He has over 40 International presentations on MTM and over 80 presentations throughout the United States. Also, for the past 12 years he has been assisting community pharmacists in Hungary to implement MTM in community pharmacies.

Additionally, Dr. Brown served on the planning committee and as a moderator for the 2005 AHRQ MTMS Expert Meeting, and on the planning committee and as speaker for UT's 2006 International Symposium on Medication Therapy Management, and served as an expert for the Future of MTM forum in Minneapolis. He has served as co-chair of the Reporting Subgroup, and co-chair of the Quality Metrics Subgroup for the Pharmacy Quality Alliance (PQA). And his is a former APhA-ASP Chapter President, former Speaker of the House for APhA-ASP and APhA, and Past Grand Regent of the Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity Inc..

Dr. Brown was born and raised in Chicago, Illinois. He has been married to his beautiful wife for 20 years and has two beautiful daughters who are 13 and 11 years old. In his spare time, he is the President of the American Pharmacists Association.

## Plenary Session Speaker: Dr. Sheila Botts



Dr. Botts is the Chief of Clinical Pharmacy Research and Academic Affairs at Kaiser Permanente-Colorado. She is a lecturer at the Colorado Skaggs School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, Denver Colorado, and is the Co-Director of the joint CU-Kaiser Permanente Pharmacy Outcomes Fellowship Program.

Dr. Botts completed her B.S. in Chemistry at Centre College in Danville Kentucky and her Pharm.D. at the University of Kentucky (1993). She completed a specialty residency in Psychiatric Pharmacy and 2-year clinical sciences research fellowship at the University of Texas Health Sciences Center at San Antonio and San Antonio State Hospital. Prior to joining Kaiser Permanente in 2011, she served on the faculty of the University of Kentucky, College of Pharmacy and St John's University in Jamaica, New York. While at the University of Kentucky, she developed and directed the ASHP accredited residency training program in Psychiatric Pharmacy at the Lexington VA Medical Center. Dr. Botts has practiced in psychiatry for over 15 years. Her research interests include pharmacy outcomes and medication adherence.

Dr. Botts is active in professional organizations and has served in a variety of leadership roles. She is currently a member of the Board of Pharmaceutical Specialties Psychiatric Pharmacy Specialty Council. She is a Past President of the College of Psychiatric and Neurologic Pharmacists (CPNP) and currently serves on the CPNP program committee and as a student mentor. She is a Fellow of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy and member of the American Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy and the American Society of Health Systems Pharmacists.
