Dear Dean Cooper:

Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, the Nation's oldest and largest Pharmaceutical Fraternity, requests permission to survey the possibility of establishing a chapter on your campus.

Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, as a professional fraternity, is dedicated to the advancement of Pharmacy, as a profession. Equally, important, however, we want to extend the educational advantages of a fraternity to the male members of your student body.

I have enclosed materials explaining Kappa Psi, its goals and objectives. I feel that we must convince you that we are an organization worthy of your campus. If, after reviewing these materials, you feel that Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity can contribute to Howard University, we would like to make this literature available to your male student body to evaluate their interest. If sufficient interest is evidenced, I would appreciate the privilege of visiting your campus and the opportunity of explaining in detail the responsibilities and obligations of membership in Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity.

Dean Cooper, I am sure that your concern is "What can Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity do for Howard University"? Acting in consort, the sum total of organized efforts will be far greater than the sum total of individual efforts. Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity sponsors professional programs, through its Chapters, to advance Pharmacy and the School. I am enclosing just one such program, "Student Recruitment."

If you convince the majority of your Brothers, you have won. If you fail to convince that majority, you have lost." We in Kappa Psi want Brothers who will work. Brothers who will give, not just take. We, in Kappa Psi want to develop pharmacist (Brothers) who are Sober in thought, Industrious in their actions, have high ideals for themselves and their profession and enjoy the Fellowship of man. Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity actively promotes and regards Scholarship.

Dean Cooper, we are not trying to be solicitors. Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity wishes to make the advantages and the demands of a Professional Fraternity available to the students at all the Colleges of Pharmacy in the United States and Canada. Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity request that you consider our petition. After reviewing the enclosed literature, if, in your opinion, we can contribute to your institution, would you permit me the privilege of visiting your campus?
