Research shows that girls in all girls' schools:

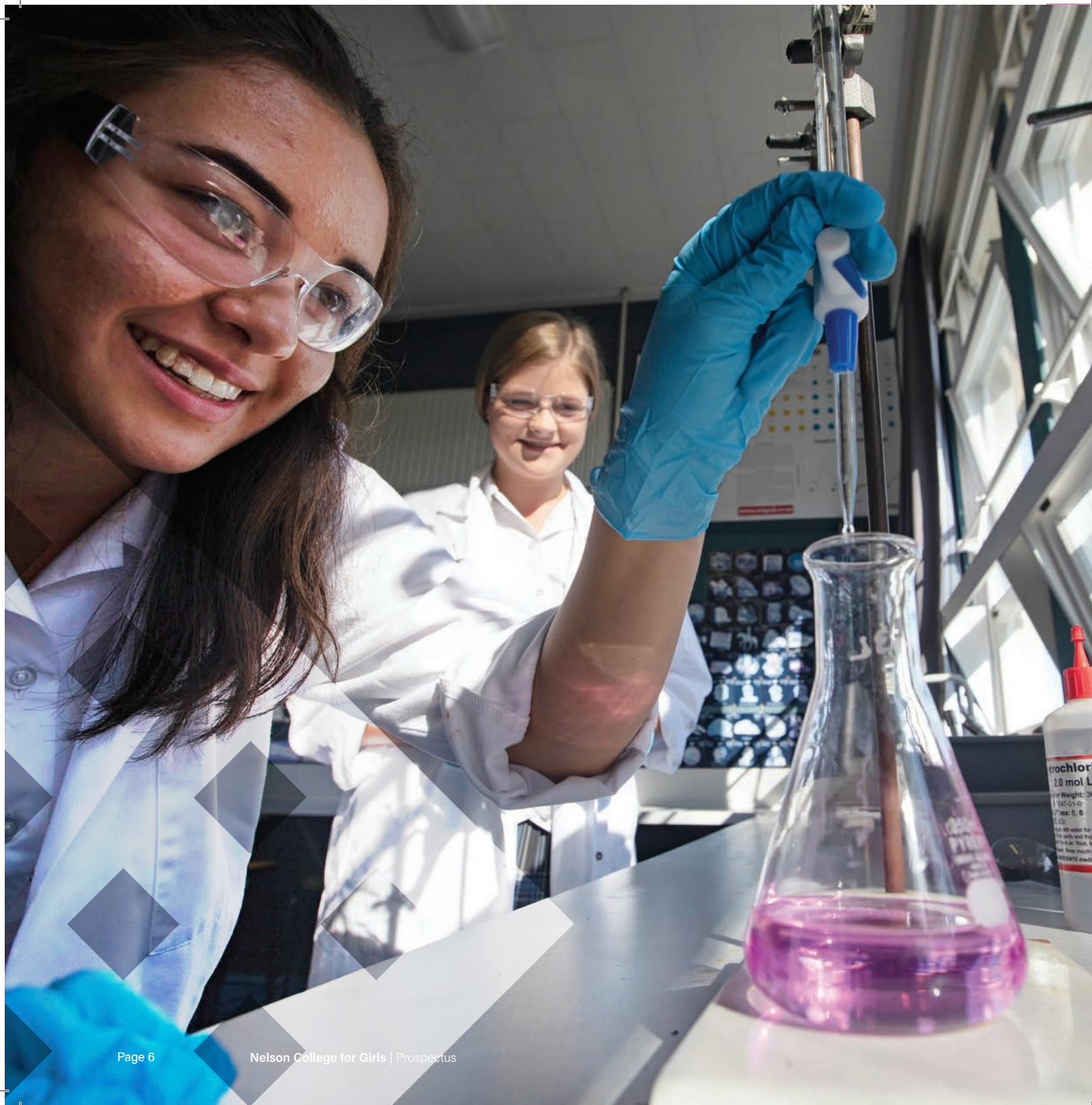
- Do better academically and are more likely to graduate from tertiary education

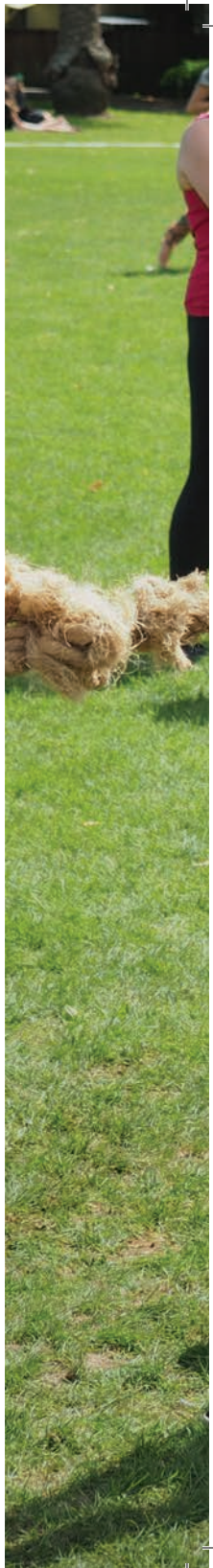
EMPOWERMENT | WHAKAMANA

At Nelson College for Girls, we encourage our students to take the lead and make things happen. Renowned for making positive environmental change in the Nelson community is our student-led Enviro Action Group. They successfully changed parking tickets to recyclable paper, called on supermarkets to remove plastic bags, and led Nelson's student strike for climate change. The only secondary school in the region with the title, Nelson College for Girls is now recognised as a Silver Enviro-School thanks to the group's activities.

The Keeping Kids Warm campaign was the brainchild of our Social Services Committee, who are engaged in local issues and raise money to make change happen. Pants are now part of our uniform, thanks to our LGBTQ group dedicated to equality.

You'll get the chance to take the lead in our whole school house competitions throughout the year, which are all about giving it a go and having fun. Also organised and run by students, tabloid events, theatre sports and themed weeks (like arts, sport, drama, music and culture - to name a few) give you the chance to step up. The colourful spectacle of HPAC (House Performing Arts Competition) is 100 hundred percent produced by students, who develop all the narration, dance and song. Girls and families tell us it is one of their absolute highlights of the school year!

In fact, there are so many opportunities at Nelson College for Girls, we guarantee you'll find one you won't have experienced before. Try kayaking, sailing, or mountain biking. Join the ski team or learn to abseil. Some student groups focus on brain-centric activities like chess, Amnesty International, or future problem solving. Want to express yourself? Try anime, kapa haka, or Rockquest. The range is enormous; here you can do anything.

As the most centrally located secondary school in Nelson, it's easy to take learning out of the classroom. Our classes take regular trips on foot to the Suter Art Gallery, Nelson Provincial Museum and the Nelson Public Library. There are also heaps of character-building activities further afield like our Year 9 Adventure Day at Teapot Valley and our Year 13 Leadership Day at Founders Heritage Park.

Students at Nelson College for Girls excel at sports like netball, rowing, athletics, rugby, football, cycling, golf, and hockey. Be involved in as many sports as you want. Some girls love being part of a team and learning from our strong network of coaches. Others join for fun and exercise. Those looking to excel go on to compete at local, national and even international levels. Our top netball team is regularly the leading school team in the regional Premier Grade and made it to the national championships last year, and we are the only the school in Nelson Tasman with a rowing team that competes annually against the country's top rowers at the Maadi Cup.

If you stand out in sport, consider joining our high performance NCG Infinity programme, with dedicated coaching, sports psychology, nutrition and visualisation. Acceptance is by application only. Meantime, everyone is welcome to join our sporting collective NCG Wings for inspirational guest speakers, coaching sessions and discounted sports gear.

GROW WITH SUPPORT

WELLBEING | ORA

Need a little support at times? We're here for you with a mentoring programme that spans all year groups to make sure you are happy, healthy and settled at school.

A nurturing, welcoming and supportive environment at school is extremely important to us. This approach is evident in our PRIDE values and the wide range of help services to make sure you are well supported and happy at school and home.

The values that guide us are spelled out in PRIDE and influence everything we do: Positivity - Ngākau reka, Respect - Manaakitanga, Integrity - Ngākau pono, Diversity - Kanorau, and Empathy - Aroha. It's how we treat each other. It's how we learn and live. It's who we are now and who we want to be in the future. Before we introduce new initiatives, recruit new staff and plan resourcing developments, we check that they fit with these social values which underpin our everyday life at Nelson College for Girls.

Our new Ārahi mentoring programme is a vertical mentoring class, with girls from Year 9 to Year 13 coming together three times a week for 30 minutes to chat about issues or topics that may be about their wellbeing or learning. The idea is for girls to get to know each other across year groups, breaking down stigmas associated with age, background and culture.

As you move through the school year after year, our Pastoral Care system will be with you throughout to ensure we understand and help you with all your needs. Deans and Kaiārahi follow and stay with you through each of your five years at school, so they will get to know you and can offer consistent support. Our Māori students, international students and boarders are supported by liaison teachers, who provide regular contact and ongoing support.

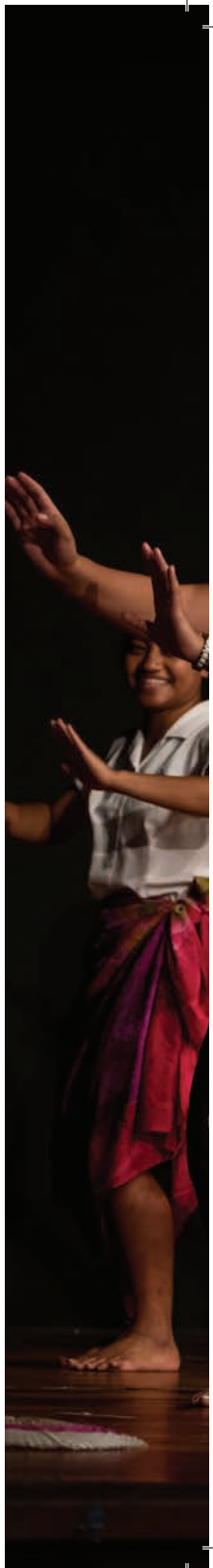
Our international and migrant students are well supported by our Pastoral Care system, while our ESOL programme helps those in need improve their English skills so they can take full part in school life. International students

are warmly welcomed into the homes of one of our dedicated host families or can choose to live in the supportive and social atmosphere of our hostel.

Local students will broaden their horizons by meeting people from all walks of life and experiencing colourful and cultural activities throughout the year. A highlight is our Cultural Diversity day, when we come together to celebrate the music, dance, food and dress of our many ethnic groups.

Whether you love drama, music or any form of art, Nelson College for Girls is the place to nurture your creativity.



If you're passionate about the arts, we can provide you with the dedicated expertise and creative opportunities so you flourish in the arts field you love.

Highly skilled teachers in our music department - with its own state-of-the-art music suite complete with high tech computer systems, stage and quality music equipment - help you discover and develop your passion. Join one of our colourful music groups like the award-winning Stella Nova choir, Jazz Band, or sign up to music lessons. Many Rockquest finalists and winners nurtured their creativity at Nelson College for Girls including Estella Romagnoli, who won the solo-duo category and best song award in the national finals in 2018.

Our visual arts department is also led by thoughtful, forward-thinking teachers, with many graduate students going on to study fine arts at tertiary level after leaving school. The department makes the most of our artistic region, taking students to exhibitions, meeting local artists, and engaging in Nelson's thriving arts scene.

In drama, you'll experience a huge range of opportunities like the Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Festival, theatre sports, joint productions with Nelson College and HPAC. Pikimai, our kapahaka group also offers a fantastic opportunity to take to the stage while learning about tikanga Māori.

STAY | MANAAKI

We're your home away from home. Come and experience traditional boarding school life in a caring, supportive environment at Clarice Johnstone House.

Boarding is a very important aspect to life at Nelson College for Girls. We host up to 150 students in the modern boarding house made up of two buildings on College grounds. They offer students comfortable, well designed facilities. The Levels, opened in 2011, offers individual accommodation for our Year 13 boarders.

Boarding students experience a wide range of learning and recreational opportunities, with mutual trust and shared responsibility.

Students living a long way from home are given particular care in a supportive, secure environment. Senior girls look after and mentor junior students in a big sister/little sister scheme that is a win-win for both groups.

We also have the option of five-days-a-week boarding for those who live close to Nelson and casual overnight stays for day students who may need it on occasion.
