- ✓ Students develop team-building skills by working in the same team of five to seven members all year.
- ✓ Students learn to examine problems and to identify the real challenge without limiting the possible solutions and their potential success.
- ✓ The creative-thinking process is nurtured and developed as a problem-solving tool.



- ✓ Students of all types will find something that will appeal to them as the program rewards unconventional thinking.
- ✓ Because Odyssey of the Mind eliminates the fear of criticism, even shy students are afforded the opportunity to open and express themselves.
- ✓ The fun of participation leads to an elevated interest in regular classroom curricula. Teachers have a program to further provide students with a well-rounded education.
- ✓ Coaches are volunteer parents or teachers, but they can only "guide" the team and teach them skills. They cannot contribute to the solution.

Everything is done by the students: ideas, decisions, script, costumes, sets, vehicles, and contraptions.
