It is with great pleasure that we report to you the results of CPC's 60th Anniversary Capital Campaign, "Celebrating our Past and Embracing New Beginnings."

The planning for the Campaign – the first such effort for CPC since 1998 – began more than two years ago, and the ambitious goal was to raise \$600,000 to underwrite new beginnings in mission, education and community outreach, environmental stewardship, and music.

Your generous response to this appeal has been truly overwhelming and reflects the energy and excitement which are so evident everywhere these days at CPC. **To date, we have received 108 pledges totaling \$647,706, and additional pledges continue to arrive. Thank you!**


Summer Surprise
