

## Following Jesus through Lent

Lent is here again – a season of soul searching in preparation for Holy Week and Easter. Traditionally, the account of the final hours of Jesus' life are read as Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday – or as part of a Maundy Thursday or Good Friday service.

These Holy Week readings are very meaningful – but they do not give us a chance to spend much time reflecting on each part of this story and what it might mean for our understanding and actions as followers of Christ in the World. This year, we will be using a variation of the ancient tradition of The Way of the Cross as a way of focusing our worship during Lent. In 1991 John Paul II initiated The Scriptural Way of the Cross as a more Biblically based and ecumenical version of the Roman Catholic tradition of the older Stations of the Cross. It is this guide for reflection and action that we will be using.

- 1<sup>st</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus on the Mount of Olives (Luke 22:39-46)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus is betrayed by Judas and arrested (Luke 22:47-48)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin (Luke 22:66-71)
- 4<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Peter denies Jesus (Luke 22:54-62)
- 5<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus is judged by Pontius Pilate (Luke 23:13-25)
- 6<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns (Luke 22:63-65)
- 7<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus takes up His cross (John 19:17)
- 8<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry His cross (Luke 23:26)
- 9<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem (Luke 23:27-31)
- 10<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus is crucified (Luke 23:33-47)
- 11<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus promises His kingdom to the believing thief (Luke 23:43)
- 12<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus speaks with His mother and disciples (John 19:26-27)
- 13<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus dies on the cross (Luke 23:44-46)
- 14<sup>th</sup> Station of the Cross: Jesus is laid in the tomb (Luke 23:50-54)

The first seven will form the basis for the sermons and liturgy for the first four Sundays of Lent. The final seven will be the basis for our Good Friday worship.

During the first four weeks of Lent, Krista Wuertz will be teaching a class that will focus on the Doctrine of the Atonement and the prison system in the United States.




## Interfaith Seder Experience

In the church’s early days, when most members lived in Claremont, members were grouped into parishes by neighborhood; each parish was assigned one Deacon, who would call on its members. As membership expanded, the parish system was changed, and parishes began to be determined alphabetically.

Now, “Parish Sunday” is an opportunity to enjoy fellowship with members of the congregation whom you may not bump into on a regular basis in your neighborhood, and for your Deacon to get to visit with you. During the 10:00 worship hour children age 4 - 5<sup>th</sup> grade will be excused from worship following the "Time with the Children" to go to the following activities:


Children ages 4 - first grade will go to Godly Play from 10:15 - 10:45.

## Bible Presentation

Each spring at Claremont Presbyterian Church we celebrate our commitment to helping the children among us grow in their faith by presenting them with a Bible of their own from the CPC community. We present these Bibles to the children during our worship service, and we have a reception to celebrate following worship. Traditionally we give children their own Bible when

they are in the third grade, but we also have Bibles for those that began worshipping at CPC after they were in third grade. ## Godly Play

During the month of March we will be helping the children participate in the season of Lent in preparation for Easter. We use a series of lessons called "The Faces of Easter" that teach about the life of Jesus that leads up to his crucifixion and resurrection. These lessons are designed to help

the children sense the continuity between Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection.

All children age 4 - grade 5 are encouraged to join us in Godly Play following "Time with The Children" in worship each Sunday.


The tour includes:

Our church is one of a number of congregations involved in serving meals three Sundays a month on a rotating basis: Claremont United Church of Christ, Friends Meeting (Quakers), Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic Church, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Claremont United Methodist Church, Monte Vista Unitarian-Universalist and Nithyananda V. Temple, Montclair.
