1. End Mass Incarceration

Reverse the policies that have led to the militarization of the police and the mass incarceration of millions of people in this country. Develop a new federal policy framework like the "Reverse Mass Incarceration Act[1]" for our justice system that shifts incarceration incentives to investment in impacted Black and Brown communities.

Universal Family Care is a government program that creates care infrastructure, provides a more comprehensive social safety net for all families, ensuring paid medical and family leave, childcare,

collectively bargain, and enforce labor standards in the public and private sectors. 3. Scale Cooperative and Social Economy Networks Harness government resources for the development of cooperative and social economy networks to build shared wealth and ownership in our communities, including policies that subsidize and offer low-interest, interest-free, or federally guaranteed financing to develop cooperatives, community land trusts, and culturally responsive health/care infrastructure that serve the needs of our communi-

1. Dismantle the School-to-Prison Pipeline

Too many young people in our communities are punished instead of provided with the educational, emotional, and mental support they need to thrive. Dismantling the school-to-prison pipeline requires divestment from police and policies that criminalize young people in schools and investment in restorative justice practices, school counselors, and other critical supports.[4]

Everyone who wants to pursue higher education should have the ability to attend college without

assuming crippling debt. College should be free for all, including students who are undocumented,

Medicare for All is a federal program for a universal, single-payer health care, guaranteed for all regardless of employment or immigration status. This would create a public, not-for-profit health care system that takes power out of the hands

A Homes Guarantee is a federal program that ensures that all people have safe, sustainable,

high-quality, and truly affordable housing as a human right. This includes investing in existing public

housing, additional social housing, programs that de-commodify housing and give communities

1. Provide a Homes Guarantee

control and ownership over their homes, tenant protections, and the creation of good, union jobs for communities that have been disproportionately impacted by gentrification, displacement, and racist housing policies.[10] 2. Secure Fair Housing Protection The Fair Housing Act aims to protect people from discrimination when they seek to rent or purchase a home, access a loan or other financial assistance, among other housing-related activities,[11]

although low-income and communities of color continue to face systemic barriers to accessing affordable, quality housing in the form of racist and discriminatory housing practices and policies. The fair housing rules must be amended to prioritize federal investment for communities that have

been disproportionately impacted. **IMMIGRATION PRIORITIES**

1. Create Pathways To Citizenship[12]

The U.S. must provide amnesty and clear pathways to citizenship for all immigrants, including those who are undocumented, Dreamers and their parents, immigrants who have Temporary Protected Status, Deferred Enforced Departure recipients, as well as refugees and asylum seekers. Additionally, the costs and administrative barriers to gaining citizenship should be greatly reduced. 2. Support Undocumented Communities

All immigrants should have equitable access to healthcare, higher education, and housing as human rights. In order to protect some of our nation's most vulnerable residents, we must disconnect our immigration and criminal justice systems. This includes ending deportation, coordination between local law enforcement and Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and public charge policies that determine immigrants' eligibility for visas or permanent residency based on whether they might access public benefits in the future. Additionally, we should extend data privacy protections to the undocumented community.
