EVENTS FOR YOUR DIARY

Australia Day at Queens Park Jan 27th

Last Meeting: January 16th 2020

President Sam Halim invited Don Fitzgerald to welcome visitors, John Lambert, (District Conference), Tony Jones, Sylvie, Di, Bambi, Alex and Maelle, and a prospective new member, Ben Taylor.

Sam iterated the welcome of all visitors and highlighted the presence of three exchange students- past Alex, present Maelle, and future, Sylvie, all of whom were to give a brief account of their current situation.

He reported that the Board Meeting on 13th January, had concentrated on our contribution options for the current bushfire recovery. Stu will be consulted with the roles we should undertake. Laurence Webb was thanked for enabling the delivery of hay to the farmers of Corryong whose pastures have been destroyed and are in need of feed for surviving farm animals.

Sam congratulated Rae and Jean Church on their 60th Wedding Anniversary.

Don Fitzgerald spoke of Healesville Rotary celebrating Australia Day on 27th January (the day gazetted as the public holiday). He suggested a BBQ with a gathering of Healesville Rotarians and their nearest and dearest and friends, to gather informally. He would welcome any suggestions and ideas that would make this an enjoyable day in celebration of inclusion that Australia offers all today.

The Christmas decorations are soon to be removed by Council employees. The decorations will then be stored.

The Community Bus loss was due to advertising costs, and therefore the Board decided to keep the bus for the time-being, and review the profitability during the coming year. Other community buses provide the town with the services that Rotary had once facilitated.

Following a fall, Don's wife Gillian broke her hip and has been hospitalised. Don thanked Rotary for the flowers delivered to her. Gillian could be home by the next weekend.

Sally Piper mentioned that Ion Whyke 's wife, Wilma had also been hospitalised following a fall that resulted in a broken ankle. Wilma is home now but will need a check up with regard to wound management next week.

Sally made mention of the Rotary 'Welcome Kit' and asked if Stu could provide a list of the names of past Youth Exchange Students.

Youth: Michael Hardinge reported that Ian Tinney and Terry Hill had attended the Somers Camps.

John Robinson: Dogs' Day Out is progressing well with advertising arrangements completed. Peter Hitchener has agreed to attend the event as a special guest.

John mentioned that he was in search of 4 Rotarians to make up a bowls team of a Wednesday night from about 6:00/6:30pm, and that an email would be sent out regarding making up a team.

We were saddened to hear that John's wife Glenda was to face surgery to have a colectomy following the 'Rotary Bowel Scan' test. Glenda will be out of action for about 6 months in order to recover. John, we wish her the best outcome, and a speedy recovery.

Community: Ian Vine noted that because of a project cancellation, money that had been allocated could perhaps be allocated for bushfire recovery, and called for any ideas in that regard.

International: Stuart McDonald mentioned that Wilma Best's Cow & Goat Project was quiet at the moment. ROMAC had contributed to "Wheel Chairs for Kids".

He mentioned that Bushfire Relief would be ongoing, and suggested that we wait a while to consider future needs.

Laurence Webb with the current bushfire situation in mind, pointed out that many social problems emanate from the stress of trauma, which can lead to family breakdown, divorce, dysfunction and guilt, amongst other situations, which become evident about 6 months after a catastrophe. He related that 'Men's Shed' had donated tools to Eildon 'Men's Shed', and that John Lambert had mentioned \$2500 had been raised by a sausage sizzle where it was noted that people gave generously -\$50 was mentioned- to buy a sausage.

Laurence completed the composition of a poem only a couple of hours before the meeting which he read with much feeling to an appreciative audience. He was inspired by an experience from the bushfires in Corryong which related the resilience of an 80 year-old farmer and his female family's desperate battle to save the house with very little water on New Year's Eve.

Michael Hardinge introduced the 'Present, Past and Future' Rotary Exchange students and invited each to give a brief account of their current situation.

Alex - 'Past' On Tuesday 28th January, Alex will experience his first day in the Australian Army and is

looking forward to his military career. This finalises the process since his application in March 2019. He mentioned the disappointment he faced when not at first accepted, but expressed his relief and excitement that now his dream has been realised. He wished Sylvie all the best with her exchange in Italy, and thanked all Rotarians for the opportunities given through Youth Exchange in his farewell.

Maelle- "Present' from Switzerland related that she just loved her first Christmas in Australia- because in Australia, you get more presents. She had shared a wonderful holiday in Canberra and climbed Mt Kosciuszko. Time was spent on Karen and David Brown's houseboat where she transferred her snow skiing skills to water skiing. Visits to the beach enabled her to surf on uncrowded beaches. When asked about her favourite Australian tourist place, she name 'Uluru'. It was reported in the Bulletin that Maelle had hoped to travel to Antarctica, but in fact it was not Antarctica, but Cairns that she hoped to visit.

Sylvie- 'Future' has been using technology to speak with members of her host family in Cremona, Italy. She will share company with a host brother and sister, with another host sister on exchange in Finland. She has also communicated with other exchange students who will spend their time in Italy. She expressed concern about leaving her friends 'back home'. She will try to get a position in a boys' soccer team while away, as no girls' soccer team is available, and soccer is her passion. She hopes her Italian language skills will improve once immersed in the Italian culture. Sylvie was presented with 4 Rotary banners to use as promotion.

Michel thanked each student and invited any member who would like to farewell Sylvie at the airport, to contact Terry Hill.

Sam wished the students well and Stu expressed that Alex was a fine example of what Youth Exchange was about. Stu quipped that Maelle wants a ticket to Antarctica, but would need a ticket to return.
