Street Outreach Alliance Project (SOAP) provides hygiene packs, basic survival supplies, and snacks to young people who otherwise may not have access to basic necessities like this. CORE's outreach practices are based in harm reduction, trauma informed care, and empowerment. We mainly focus on ags 16-30 but will provide services to anyone we encounter. Services provided to the community include: hygiene and basic survival supplies, snacks, harm reduction supplies (cleans, naloxone/narcan, condoms, etc.), resource navigation. Our primary focus is to both literally and figuratively 'meet people where they are at' whatever this may look like. Each person we serve has an unique set of goals and we make it a point to be consistently listening, engaging, and adapting our approach to best meet the needs of each individual.

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING IS TEMPORARY HOUSING WITH THE INTENTION OF TRANSITIONING RESIDENTS INTO PERMANENT, AFFORDABLE HOUSING. TRANSITIONAL HOUSING IS FREE AND OFTEN PAIRED WITH CASE MANAGEMENT TO ASSIST RESIDENTS IN CREATING AND REACHING LIFE GOALS.

If you are literally homeless (camping or sleeping in a car or shed), you can ask to be put on the Centralized Wait List. If you are on that list, you can qualify for housing with:

Rapid Rehousing Program: pays application fees, move in deposits, rent, and utility payments for two years. Also provides case management.

Transitional Housing Program: for female identifying youth ages 16-21. You live in apartments upstairs from New Roads, and this program has intensive case management by the on-site property manager

If you are couch surfing, or staying with people but don't have a fixed, regular address, you may be eligible for:

Transitional Living Program: each enrolled client can get up to \$1500 of financial assistance to move into a new apartment. They will work with you to prepare you to get into housing, and you will need to prove you can pay rent before they will pay a deposit.

Youth cannot have a history of arson or abusive actions towards others or animals. Youth cannot have an immediate need for drug, alcohol or psychiatric treatment. There are short term (30 day) and long term (duration of high school career) housing options based on youth need.
