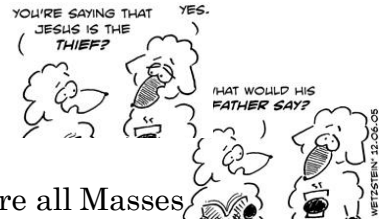

6/24 Mission Cooperative Sunday

This year missionaries from Four Dioceses will be in our area: two from India, one from Africa and one from Malaysia. Money collected will be split evenly between these groups. In the Kumba Diocese of Africa consisting of 20 parishes, 250 mission stations 4,000 square miles and 260,00 is served by 42 priests who are on the move by whatever means are possible. The great majority are subsistence farmers, so they have basically nothing. There are great needs to address basics like: safe water, education, catechesis and improve health. In the Miri Diocese of Malaysia Bishop Ng has plans to build kindergartens in the rural areas; they are building one now for 500 students. These are hardworking people who simply have nothing. The school will be staffed by lay volunteers and two Sisters who will train them and administer the school so it can provide the knowledge, spiritual values the parents want for their children.

Mon. 6/11 Memorial of Saint Barnabas

Most know him as the Apostle who introduced the converted St Paul. Called an Apostle, Barnabas was actually a convert after Christ’s death who became a serious member of the original Christian Community in Jerusalem.

Wed. 6/13 Memorial of Saint Anthony of Padua

There are many St Anthonys. This is the saint you pray to, to find things; probably because when someone stole a book that was very valuable to him and he prayed until the book came back and the person and returned to the Order. He lived only into his mid30’s yet, always honoring God’s call, served him in many places and in many ways. Take the time to read about him. *“Attribute to God every good that you have received.
