Position Description

CCL Fellows will research and build relationships with diverse advocacy organizations, organize briefings, with minimal guidance, and occasionally shadow CCL's Senior Director of Government Affairs on the Hill. Fellows should have a high level of interest in policy and the legislative process. Fellows will become conversant with CCL's tools, and methods, which are designed to empower all citizens to engage in advocacy and outreach work in pursuit of a healthy future. Training and guidance will be provided, but the position is intended for motivated self-starters who have completed undergraduate education in a related field.

Location and Hours:

Washington, D.C., 20-25 hours per week

Fellowship Benefits:

CCL Fellows will become conversant with the operation of progressive organizations both nationally and at the state level, and gain the opportunity to network and meet fellows from CCL's partner organizations, as well as staff members from numerous congressional offices. They will gain the experience of independently developing educational and briefing programs to participate in an international conference and lobby day. College credit available if applicable.

The fellowship carries a \$3,500 stipend.

Responsibilities

- Fellow should be detail oriented, organized, and able to work independently
- Fellow must be able to work as a team and accept constructive criticism
- Average or above average level of computer literacy (skills in Photoshop, Illustrator, Word, Excel, Access, and a collection database would be an advantage)
