

Provision Map Prioritisation


Financial Transparency

- Provision is based on hours per EHCP element 3 (high needs top up funding) for LA hours, EP, <u>SaLT</u>, Therapy etc. with staffing and SLA's reflecting this.
- Individualised EHCP provision map clearly communicated in advance of the academic year (end of Summer term) and reviewed in the annual review process.
- Element 2 "K" funding clearly accounted for in Additional Learning Admin, SENDCo, department 'on-costs'.
- Element 2 funding communicated through school website and SEND Information Report.

Equity of Provision

- Maths, English, science are provisioned first with humanities taking spare lessons as a general principal for the provision map.
- An exception to this is where VI students need support in PE or DT due to H&S.
- An exception also where students have a clearly identified academic need (eg. dyslexia / dyscalculia, therefore a corresponding weighting in numerate / literate subjects).
- EAL provision to operate as flexible to the level of need. Assessed threshold of basic English proficiency before student support is removed.
- 72 hours are used to target SEND students to attend extracurricular clubs and activities (VI, LAC, ASC), deliver targeted clubs (jewellery making and cooking) and after-school provision for assistance with homework and Lexia in the LRC.

Green Door Girls' Group

Started to ensure that there was a forum for a student led group to share:

- Coping strategies with each other
- Common issues they find challenging
- Advise staff and create staff training resources
- Advise on policy changes and purchases
- Advise the local authority and primary schools on autism
- Share special interests and promote a culture of acceptance

Green Door Girls' Group

Asked by Dr Jason Apaloo-Shonibare Child and Educational Psychologist, Hackney Education to:

- Promote SEND Pupil Voice efforts from Hackney Education.
- promote the amazing work they are already doing
- continue to provide and build on their current platforms
- develop further self-advocacy skills within members and potentially provide reimbursement for their time (likely vouchers)
- consider with members whether they might be open to joining the effort during Autism Awareness week and sharing any art-work. ideas or stories (various platforms are possible)

PhD thesis: Missing: The autistic girls absent from mainstream secondary schools. A study that prioritised the voices of adolescent autistic girls as essential in understanding their lack of access to education, and engaged them as participants and co-collaborators in knowledge production.

- She will work with 4 selected students and their parents 1:1 on March 3rd and March 10th on life charts and feedback around emotional based school avoidance and autism.
- Twilight session with Anna Feltham and Colin Gall to discuss outcomes and next steps.
- Recorded staff training session on autistic girls.
- Virtually attend the autistic girls' group on Thursday 23rd March (online).
