## **QUARTERLY COUNCIL MEETING**

WCMEW held its quarterly Council meeting on March 12. Main agenda items included:

- An update from the "Promoting Healthcare Careers" work group. Lead Liz Bush, state Director of AHEC, indicated that their 2024 focus will include partnering with the Department of Public Instruction and using DPI's "<u>Patient</u> <u>Care Career Pathway</u>", a tool to help promote healthcare careers in middle and high schools. The goal is to build statewide awareness of healthcare careers, increase the adoption of this tool in middle and high schools, and support its ongoing revision and enhancement. AHEC has retained an intern to spearhead this effort.
- A status report on the "Addressing Clinical Training and Retention" work group's efforts thus far. Lead Dr. Lisa Dodson, Dean of the Medical College of Wisconsin's Central Wisconsin Campus, outlined the group's 2024 goals:
  - Improve coordination and communication between health systems and educational programs, and expand the number of clinical sites and opportunities.
  - Help facilitate higher retention rates

Dr. Dodson indicated that some key initial tasks were to identify key decisionmakers and gather success stories on retention.
