WHEN CIRCULATING NOMINATION PAPERS FOR MAYOR PAUL SOGLIN

1. **Sign and date the certificate at the bottom of the form AFTER you are done collecting signatures. If the date of your certification is before the date people sign, those signatures are invalid. This is the most common mistake circulators make.**
2. As a circulator, you will be signing a certificate that says that you personally obtained each signature. Please do not leave nomination papers unattended anywhere, such as in lunchrooms or break areas as a way to obtain signatures.
3. **Please check to see that the signer indicates the correct date in the far right-hand box.**
4. A person may sign only one candidate's nomination paper for a given office in an election period.
5. Please DO NOT number the pages in the bottom right hand corner. The campaign will enter page numbers.
6. Signers must be qualified electors and reside in Wisconsin.
7. Signers do not need to be registered to vote to sign the nomination papers.
8. Circulators can also be one of the signatories on the nomination papers they are circulating, if they are electors in Wisconsin.
9. We would like to have all nomination papers in hand by Wednesday, May 16 2018 so we have ample time to check them for compliance with the election law requirements before they need to be turned in to the Wisconsin Elections Commission.
