

FIRE PREVENTION ORDER

NEVADA STATE OFFICE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR

Under the authority of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43 U.S.C. 1701 et. seq.) and pursuant to 43 CFR 9212.2, the following acts are prohibited or restricted on all public land areas, roads and trails located within and administered by the BLM Nevada State Office.

Acts Restricted by Fire Prevention Order

1. Building a campfire, warming, or cooking fire without a minimum of 6 feet clear of vegetation or combustible materials, not attending at all times, and not extinguishing properly.
2. Smoking in an area not devoid of vegetation and not properly extinguishing/disposing of when finished.
3. Operating or parking a vehicle or other motorized equipment over or on top of dried/cured vegetation.
4. Operating a motor vehicle or combustion engine equipment without a spark arrestor and off of existing paved, gravel or dirt roads. (43 CFR 8343.1(c)).
5. Welding, metal grinding or operating an acetylene torch with open flames.
6. Possessing, discharging, using or allowing the use of fireworks, pyrotechnic or incendiary devices.
7. Shooting, igniting or causing to burn; explosives or explosive material, including binary explosive targets.
8. Discharging a firearm using tracer, incendiary, or steel-component ammunition. [Use of tracer or incendiary ammunition is always prohibited on public lands].

Acts Recommended by Fire Prevention Order

1. Possession of shovel, fire extinguisher and/or at least 5 gallons of water should be on hand in the event of an unintentional fire start.


Pursuant to 43 CFR 9212.2, each of the following persons is exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any federal, state, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.


Additional restrictions may be enacted based upon fuel and weather conditions.

Title 43 CFR 9212.0-5, 9212.1 and 9212.4 Wildfire Prevention provides that any person who knowingly and willfully performs any act restricted by a Fire Prevention Order, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000 or to imprisonment of not more than 12 months or both. Restitution for total suppression and damage costs incurred will be borne by the trespasser.

This Fire Prevention Order is effective 12:01 AM, on the 30th day of May, 2020 and will remain in effect until the 31st day of October, 2020 unless rescinded.
