

Budgeting for your backyard



There is so much confusion out there when it comes to budgeting for your backyard.

Projects can cost anywhere from \$5,000 to \$50,000 to \$500,000; and contractors are often hesitant to reveal pricing upfront.

When getting multiple quotes, clients often ask us what the difference is between two project estimates for seemingly the same thing. We have another guide that outlines what to look for in a quote, to help break the specifics down a little further—but for this guide we want to give you a bigger-picture idea.

The advice we offer in this guide is based on years of working with past clients and learning from previous projects. Frequently-Asked Questions

How much do different elements cost?

In the Indianapolis market, a paver patio is often fully installed for about \$30 per sq. ft.

Factors that affect the price of a paver patio include site access, paver selection, jointing material, size, shape etc. Each project is unique and quoted that way. Sometimes it might be on the lower end and closer to 25\$ per sq ft. Sometimes it might be on the higher end and a little north of 35\$ per sq ft. This is a good ballpark for a fully finished paver patio—meaning it includes all material, all labor and site repair. Based on these numbers, most families could install a 500 sq ft patio for about 15k.

We've broken down the pros and cons of paver patios vs. concrete patios in a separate guide.

A pool can be anywhere from 60-120k.

Pools are one of the most fun elements to add to your backyard, and they vary significantly in cost. We work with a myriad of pool contractors. Our team will design the space around your pool, but the pool contractor will install and plumb it. Check out our pool planning guide for more info.

Outdoor kitchens range from 8-15k.

The price here depends on the number of appliances you plan to include, the materials you use in the construction, and the size. We've installed a wide variety of outdoor kitchen nooks, and they add a lot to an outdoor space. If you can dream it, we can build it.

Other elements, like landscaping, are harder to estimate per square foot, since there are so many variables involved in the execution. If you have ideas about specific features you want to include in your yard, our landscape designers can talk you through different options that affect the cost.

Which features are going to give me the biggest bang for my buck?

Fire pits offer one of the best returns on investment and are generally inexpensive relative to the patio around them.

They range from \$1,500-\$5,000, depending on whether you want a gas or wood burning variety. In contrast, a fire*place* can be \$15-25k. Gas lines to the firepit can add some expense but are usually worth it; they allow you to instantly turn the firepit on and off. A fire pit can be a gathering place for family and friends; it can create a cozy atmosphere for cuddling up with a book; and it's a fun way to grill out or enjoy s'mores. It's a versatile addition for a relatively low cost.

Landscape lighting is another item that offers a great return on investment.

Lighting is a great addition to any project. The lights come on every night independently and have 15-year manufacturer warranties. Once they are in you never have to mess with them. They add a wonderfully soft, ambient atmosphere and allow you to use your patio or pool past dark. Lighting is also the number one thing homeowners say they are glad they spent the money on; lighting done right can really transform your space.

Shade umbrellas are a fraction of the cost of other shade alternatives.

While a pergola can cost \$5–6k and pavillions range from \$15–30k, a large shade umbrella gets the job done just as well for \$2–4k. If you're looking for a way to escape the heat on sunny days without breaking the bank, this is definitely what we recommend. Shade umbrellas are affordable, visually appealing, and they help create your perfect space.

Our advice

As you consider a cost/benefit analysis for your outdoor space, it's helpful to decide how you want to use the space and why. Think about what you value.

As we mentioned above, an outdoor kitchen can range from \$8–15k. That may sound crazy, but if it's fully-loaded (grill, fridge, sink, trash ...) and you use it every day all summer it can start to pay off quickly. The same can be said about a fire pit, pool or hot tub. Anything you value and use won't 'cost' a lot, because the benefits will outweigh your investment.

Commission a custom design for your outdoor space
