Extension of voting privileges (with the exception of voting on pastoral relations items): **Moved by** Brenda Pielle **Seconded by** Elaine McDonald "that voting privileges be extended to all those attending this meeting with the exception of any votes involving pastoral relations." **Carried**

Moved by Pat Krell Seconded by Phyllis Brown "that the agenda be accepted". Carried

Minutes of the Annual General meeting of March 3, 2019:

Moved by Mac Fraser **Seconded by** Sandra Lacelle "that the minutes of the Annual General meeting of March 3, 2019 be accepted." **Carried**

Adoption of the 2019 Reports as printed excluding the Treasurer's Report:

Moved by Wendy Barker **Seconded by** Elaine McDonald "that the proposed budget of \$149,413 for 2020 be accepted." **Carried**


Review of Financial Books for 2020:

Greetings and Blessings



POWELL RIVER UNITED CHURCH CAMP SPIRIT REPORT JUNE 2020

Summer Camp was definitely going to be different the summer of 2020. First, due to the change over from the Island Presbytery, to the Pacific Mountain Regional Distract many operational and administrative changes were in the progress of happening. Then with Covid-19 everything was put on hold.

The middle of May, we received an email that Camp Spirit Team was cancelling camps in the areas where staff would have to be billeted. They felt it would be safer for all parties involved.

Early in June, we received an email Sarah Prestwich of Youth & Young Adult Minister: Island.

Their group was offering Household Camp Kits, with additional kits for each child pertaining to his or her age.

Christina Atkinson also mentioned camp kits and when contacted said something special would be put in the kits for Powell River.

Brenda Pielle put together a list of the campers for 2018 and 2019 and our church families including some families that come to her groups.

We ordered kits for 29 households. 6 kits for 12yrs + 40 kits for 6-11yrs 9 kits for 3-5 yrs

The total came to \$293.25; this includes a 25% discount. The monies came from The Child, Youth and Family Fund.

There was also be a Virtual Camp that families could register for. We distributed this information to the families when delivered the kits.

At the start of last year (just before the pandemic) we had a Congregational Gathering in preparation for welcoming and sharing the Church facilities with the Faith Lutheran congregation – remember? We even named the gathering "Perfect Vision" inspired by the year 2020.

Looking back, how many of us now agree that the year 2020 was perfect? Not being able to worship together in person at our Church for a whole year is perfect? That is not what any of us had planned. Yet I suppose in truth, it was God's plan all along, and to see it that way requires our perfect vision.

Who knew maintaining our perfect vision throughout the year 2020 would be so challenging? It's not so easy to accept God's plan when it doesn't fit our picture of how we think our life should be.

When the lockdown started, the Communications Ministry began working with the Light of God Ministry to shift our Worship Services from in person to online using our website, video recordings, and email to maintain our communication and connection with each other.

Our first virtual video worship service was on March 29th, 2020. Since then we produced 79 more videos throughout the remainder of 2020, including 28 Family Fun Videos with Brenda Pielle.

Throughout all of last year, we had people visit our website 7,400 times with over 4,000 unique visitors. We emailed out 47 weekly E-newsletters and published over 200 blog posts to our website, and shared those messages with our Facebook community.

I guess that is one of the main benefits for our Church during the pandemic; we were able to connect with many more people outside of our congregation with our message: Serve with Love.

Thanks to everyone who participated online throughout 2020. Thanks for emailing in your photos so we could share them in our weekly E-newsletter, and in our Christmas Pageant video.

Most of all, thanks to everyone for putting in a valiant effort towards maintaining your perfect vision, and for continuing to Serve with Love.

We look forward to seeing what God's plan is for the year 2021. Stay tuned.

For the Love of It!



MINISTRY AND PERSONNEL ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2020

In 2020, there were no changes to the Powell River United Church staffing levels but there was considerable change as to how our staff and contractors operated. As of March 2020, worship gatherings for both congregations were cancelled and a Covid-19 plan was put in place regarding the limited operations of the church office and traditional building rentals.

None of our pre-pandemic renters, nor any new ones, chose to meet in our building after March 2020. With this drastic reduction in building use, the Janitor voluntarily reduced his hours and was on a stand-by status in case worship gatherings re-commenced.

The Secretary maintained her regular working hours in the church office to provide a corporate presence while the Minister, Director of Music, Bookkeeper, Communications contractor and Reaching Out to Families Project contractor worked remotely. The Minister, Director of Music and Communications contractor created and sustained online worship services throughout the year with huge success that increased attendance at worship gatherings by at least double. The development and fielding of a newsletter and daily devotionals online involved staff and volunteers of the church and contributed greatly to the wellbeing and engagement of the congregation during the pandemic.

In November 2020, the Navigation Team decided to reduce the Secretary, Janitor and Director of Music hours by 50% effective 1 January 2021 in light of the ongoing reduction of service due to the pandemic.

All staff are expected to continue in their employment for the coming year and are ready to transition to in-person gatherings and a continuing online presence after the pandemic.

PADDLE GROUP ANNUAL REPORT 2020

This year's Paddle Group report is taken from the final report to the Justice & Reconciliation Fund of the United Church of Canada which partially funded the Blanket Exercise workshop.

Powell River United Church (PRUC) was honoured to present a very successful Blanket Exercise on Saturday February 22nd, 2020 from 10 am to 2:30 pm

This workshop had been previously hosted by PRUC once before in early 2017 and was well attended at that time by mostly PRUC members.

The blanket exercise was presented by *taxumajehjeh*, a group of individuals from the local Tla'amin First Nation who are trained and experienced in presenting this workshop. The blanket exercise has recently been updated and revamped to include more history of local and recent events.

The workshop was presented by 3 facilitators along with 2 Elders and attended by 32 individuals most of whom were from the broader Powell River Community, 10 PRUC participants and 22 from the community.

When the formal presentation ended there was a period of reflection where each participant shared their emotions and reactions to what they had just experienced. Because there were close to the maximum number of participants this part of the workshop took twice as long as the time allotted but the sharing was profound, powerful, open and honest.

Following the time of individual sharing the two Elders did a traditional "cedar brushing" of each participant to brush away any and all residual fear, anxiety & other negative emotions/feelings brought up by experiencing the exercise.

After this cleansing an evaluation form was distributed for reflection and feedback and the Justice & Reconciliation Funding support from the United Church of Canada was announced and acknowledged.

To wrap up and round out this powerful event a potluck feast, including some traditional indigenous foods, was blessed and shared to honour the presenters and Elders.

Evaluation Results:

According to the evaluations returned (21 in total) we believe the goals of the exercise/workshop were not only met but exceeded.

Question #1 "How did you learn about this workshop?"

Posters - 5; Media Ads - 5; Social Media - 7 and Word of Mouth - 4.

Question #2 "What new information did you gain?"

Most respondents learned history from an Indigenous perspective.

Many learned how the Indian Act has kept Indigenous people "wards of the state" with little or no legal control over their lives and freedoms

Many also were amazed at how well the Canadian government has kept the injustice of the Indian Act hidden from the Canadian public and that its devastating effects continue to this very day.

Question #3 "What feelings came up for you today?"

Guilt, sadness, anger, heartbreak, regret, shame, horror, fear and conflicted were the most common responses.

Question #4 "Going forward, how will you walk differently in your life?"

Most people responded that they will speak out against injustice, bigotry, prejudice and racism.

Many expressed a desire to be more empathetic and learn more about Indigenous history and traditions.

Several stated that they will try to get more involved and seek out ways to reconcile and heal our two communities.

Recommendations for other United Church Faith Communities:

The Blanket Exercise was developed by Kairos which is a Canadian Ecumenical Justice Initiative.

Kairos collaborated with Indigenous Elders, knowledge keepers, and educators when creating the Blanket Exercise and has provided training to individuals across Canada to be facilitators of this experiential learning program.

Powell River United Church highly recommends that Faith Communities across Canada seek out local presenter groups and host a Blanket Exercise. It will strengthen and enhance your entire community and foster deeper understanding and healing between colonizers and Indigenous communities.

2020 ANNUAL PROPERTY REPORT (SACRED GROUNDS)

Accomplishments in 2020:

- -Reorganized the entry to Trinity hall by installing a bulletin board and shelf in the entry way in Trinity for PRUC and the Faith Lutherans to put up our notices.
- -Reorganized a room of the chancel so that the Lutherans had a place to store their possession that are used on a regular basis in their worship services.
- -Reorganized an unused room in the basement so the Lutheran could store items that are only used occasionally.
- -Reorganized the office to fit in a desk and filing cabinet for the Lutherans to use.
- -PRUC was the recipient of about 60 chairs from the Lutheran church which are being used to replace chairs that were becoming decrepit.

Security has been increased in the building because of the lack of use and people not around during Covid-19:

- -Put a mail slot in the parking lot entrance door so that the mail would be securely delivered inside the building.
- -Installed a dead bolt lock in the parking lot door to make the door more secure.
- -Tied shut from the interior all the doors that are double doors or that open with a panic bar, so that people can't pry them open from the outside. The two remaining doors have dead bolts and are more difficult to open.
- -Lowered the Venetian blinds in the basement and moved the chairs away from the wall where the windows are, to make it more difficult for entry if someone were to break a window to gain entry.
- -The building is kept locked in 3 zones. If someone gets into the basement, there is a lock preventing them from going upstairs. If someone breaks into Trinity, the sanctuary is locked from the inside to prevent entry.
- -Twice-weekly inspections are being done of the exterior and interior of the church buildings to ensure all is in order.

-Monthly, all toilets are being flushed and cold water is turned on at the sinks to ensure the drain traps are full of water.

Some projects did occur in 2020:

- -The upstairs room in Trinity was cleaned up and reorganized, with the helpful advice of several UCW ladies.
- -Space was opened up in one corner and rented to the Timberline Quilters Guild so that they could have a storage spot for their display props, which are used every 2 years at Dwight Hall.
- -A team of men removed shrubs in front of the hall between Trinity and the Sanctuary, as previously they required trimming 2 to 3 times a year. The area was covered with a filter fabric and drain rock.
- -The basement windows were re-caulked where necessary, and the window frames were repainted.
- -Lawn maintenance is ongoing.
- -Assisted Faith Lutheran people with setting up and taking down the outside creche during the Christmas season.
- -Set up timed lighting in the sanctuary to illuminate 2 of the stained glass windows during the evenings over the Christmas season.

When the Covid-19 restrictions are lifted, the small 20 - year old under-the-counter fridge in the basement will need to be replace. It has stopped working.

Memorial Gardens:

Though not many people got to see it in 2020, the gardens were attended to by Del Mansell and Ian Mckenzie, and I loved looking at it during the year. I found it calming.

Thank you to Tom Parsons, Gary Ellwyn, Brian Walker, Jay Lawler, and Brian Finlayson—people that can be called on in time of need.

<u>POWELL RIVER UNITED CHURCH – ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2020</u> <u>REACHING OUT TO FAMILIES PROGRAM</u>

The calendar year of 2020 has been extraordinary as we have journeyed together through the difficult challenge of living in a global pandemic. The Reaching Out to Families programs that were started in the spring of 2019 were able to continue, and were modified, with the financial support and flexible timelines provided by the ProVision Fund from the Pacific Mountain Region of the United Church of Canada.

At the start of this year, program planning was much the same as it had been in the season before. A playgroup for parents and toddlers was scheduled for two Friday mornings each month, a Family Fun night was to be held once per month, and some workshops were scheduled. These activities were being enjoyed by families who were regular attendees at Sunday morning worship, and also by families who had no other connections to our church. For example, seven different families comprising of nine children, attended the parent tot play group in the first three months of this year. Four of the families had a regular connection to our church with two of those being new, and three of the families did not have any connection to our church.

When the church closed for the pandemic precautions, there was no activity for the months of April, May, and June. The Navigation Team invited me to consider if there was any way to bring any of the programming on line. The ProVision Fund administrators informed us at this time that there was no need to worry about wrapping up the use of the funding which originally was scheduled to end in May of 2020. Working closely with Tyler Nouwens, our specialist for communications, in July I began providing video recordings of "sing a long" and "story time" sessions, one geared for

parents and toddlers, and one aimed at families in general. Tyler posted these on our website via our YouTube channel. The response to these videos seems to be quite positive. On the YouTube channel it is possible to see how many "views" each video has received and this can be similar to a measure of attendance. These numbers can change over time as it is possible to watch any given video months after it has been posted. The following table captures the numbers of views as they appear at the time of the writing of this report.

The songs that have been chosen for these videos are a mixture of Christian songs (eg. "Jesus Loves Me") and popular secular songs. (eg. "You Are My Sunshine"). The stories that have been shared are either oral descriptions of something found or observed in nature, or secular stories that capture Christian values such as friendship, sharing, love, peace, etc. The advent videos also contain a simple craft idea.

An email message was sent out to families each month from July to December and these messages often contained an attached article about a topic of interest for parents, as well as encouragement to look at the videos. Emails were sent to families who regularly attend our church, families who had their children enrolled in our summer day camp programs, and families who had attended any of the in person family events during 2019 and the first three months of 2020.

The Reaching Out to Families program also provided some hand delivered items to families during this pandemic year. Our region provided "Day Camp at Home" kits which Powell River United purchased for previous day camp families. I collated those kits and delivered them to homes in August. At the beginning of Advent I put together some craft bags and delivered them to families who are enrolled in our Kids United program. These two processes provided some fun things for children to do at home, and gave me a chance to say "hello" in person to some of our parents, which was enjoyable. We received positive feedback about how some parents really appreciated receiving these items.

I wish to express my gratitude to the Pacific Mountain Region's ProVision Fund for making this outreach to families possible, to the Navigation Team for their support of this work, and to the children, youth, and families who have participated and make fulfilling this role a special joy.

TRUSTEES' 2020 ANNUAL REPORT

The Trustees held an email meeting in April of 2020 to look at the terms of our insurance policy. The policy was renewed June 1, 2020 effective for 1 year.

The highlights of the insurance policy are:

The premium is now \$9,931 for 12 months, up from \$7,639 the previous year—a 30% increase. This increase seems pretty standard in the industry. The premium is still less by \$4,000 than the last time the Trustees put it out to tender 3 years ago. We are insured through a group policy under the United Church of Canada.

We are insured for \$3,349,321 replacement. We do not have earthquake insurance. The deductible for that would be 10%, or basically \$334,932 before we could make a claim.

Our deductible for theft is \$2,500. To lower the deductible to an amount such as \$1,600 would cost almost \$1,200, making it not worthwhile. We do have a deduction in the premium for the fire alarm system.

We do not have a deductible for the security alarm because we are not alarming the building. The deduction is only \$300 and from past experience is not sufficient to pay City Hall for false alarms. The risk of false alarms is great with so many people having keys and using the building. The premiums are being paid monthly.

Covid Responsibilities:

We have to have 2x weekly inspections of the building if the building is not being used. Even though the church secretary has been present in the building, the property group did the twice weekly security inspection.

If the building were to be closed down and never reopening, then the low windows would have to be boarded up. Presently the building isn't considered empty.

The Permissive Tax exemption was applied for in April and approved by City Council.

The following people are the Trustees:

They are on 5- year terms. The year after their name is the year their term is finished: Bob Simonar (22); Allan Barker (21); Gary Ellwyn (22) and Mac Fraser (25)

Allan Barker will stand for nomination if the congregation so wishes.

TREASURER'S REPORT - 2020

"We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ." $\sim I$ Thess. 1:3 (NIV)

The year 2020 can perhaps best be described as a year of endurance — and we have indeed endured as we've found new ways to connect, reach out, and serve with love.

Quite surprisingly, we were again able to finish the year without incurring a deficit, despite not passing a weekly offering plate, or being able to hold fund-raising events, or receiving fees from the many groups that regularly use the building.

There are some significant reasons for this balanced financial picture, and we need to be aware of them as we go into a new year:

- -We were able to access \$22,114 in federal funding for wage subsidies to compensate for Covid-19 impacts; this will not continue through 2021.
- -We were fortunate that the Faith Lutheran congregation paid a building user fee of \$1,000/month from February to December, even though they were unable to use the building.
- -We did not pay for janitorial services for the 9 1/2 months that the building was closed. When we re-open, janitorial service will be essential, and may need to increase to meet stricter public health requirements.
- -We benefited from a pension adjustment on the minister's compensation.

It is also important to note that a key component of our continued ministry has been the development of our social media outreach and virtual worship services, as well as on-line activities for children and families. These have been initiated through Pro-Vision grant funds, which will have been exhausted early in 2021. Because both the Communications and Young Families projects are so key to maintaining a relevant ministry during and

after Covid-19, we are stepping out in faith to request inclusion of these services in the 2021 PRUC budget.

We are pleased that the General Council has decided not to increase the denominational assessment for 2021. On the other hand, we recognize that the insurance rates continue to rise exponentially and therefore anticipate another substantial increase when we renew in May 2021.

We currently hold two special investment funds:

- The **Manse Fund**, from the sale of the manse some years ago, was invested so that the income generated would be available to pay the minister's housing allowance. This amount is now incorporated into the minister's salary, but the investment continues to pay that important supplement.
- The **Legacy Fund**, comprises donations made with the expectation that the income generated could support special projects. At the Annual Meeting of 2019, the congregation approved an increase from 50% to 100% of investment income to be available for projects, and the use of principal for ongoing expenses if and when the survival of the local church depended on this. In 2020, we approved grants of \$500 for the Blanket Exercise and \$1,500 for the Communications Project.

I so appreciate all those who have contributed time, expertise, and funding towards our ongoing ministries. In particular, I would like to thank those who have shared in "Shepherding Our Resources". Though I have not met often with the Finance Committee during our closure, I have known I could call upon their wisdom at any point. The offering counters and cheque-signers worked quietly behind the scenes to keep things running smoothly. Christine Demkiw's faithful work as Envelope Secretary is invaluable. Donna Lloyd deserves special mention (and maybe several medals!) for not only maintaining the book-keeping, bill payments, receipting, and payroll, but also sorting through all the new forms and formats for the government subsidies and reports that have come with Covid-19. Thank-you, all!
