For comparison, the current average mix of resources supplying California includes: Eligible Renewables (33.1%), Large Hydroelectric (12.2%), Coal (2.7%), Natural Gas (37.1%), Nuclear (9.3%), Other (0.2%), and Unspecified Power (5.4%). This resource mix was estimated by the California Energy Commission based on the electricity sold to California consumers during 2020.
