After three years working in a small quintessential family practice with two longstanding family physicians, she established Rockingham Family Healthcare Collaborative Inc. to provide primary care using a holistic approach. Having experienced patients with various environmentally acquired illnesses, she created a separate medical practice, Regenix Healing LLC, to treat these patients. She continues to maintain both practices today.

Peg holds Masters' degrees in both science and business and is in the final stages of a Doctoral program. She has been a clinical nursing instructor of pediatrics at St. Anselm College in New Hampshire and provided clinical preceptorship to more than thirty nurse practitioner students from Boston College, Massachusetts General Hospital School of Health Sciences, Rivier University and the University of New Hampshire. She has completed a two-year, intensive herbal apprenticeship in the didactic, therapeutic and field work of herbalism at the Boston School of Herbal Studies.

As a result of working in an area endemic for Lyme disease, Peg developed a subspecialty in the diagnosis and treatment of tick born infections. It was the interest in this area that led her to Dr. Shoemaker's research into Chronic Inflammatory Response Syndrome (CIRS) in 2011 and subsequent certification. Based on Dr. Shoemaker's work, Peg organized a group of 15 clinicians and other professionals in New England who meet quarterly for information sharing related to treating patients with CIRS.
