<u>Commissioner Mike Fredrickson, District 2</u> - Commissioner Fredrickson is currently serving his third term on the Port of Walla Walla Commission and represents District 2, which includes the eastern third of the City of Walla Walla, Dixie, Waitsburg and Prescott areas. Commissioner Fredrickson is a 1988 graduate of Walla Walla High School and a 1992 graduate of Washington State University with a BS degree in Agri-Business. 





Walla Walla Regional Airport Inbound Passengers: 2003 - 2018 YTD Thru April



Walla Walla Regional Airport Outbound Passengers: 2003 - 2018 YTD Thru April


