

U.S. CONGESTION BY NUMBERS




Collisions, Deaths and Injuries Are Up

- Vehicle deaths in the U.S. last year: Over 40,000—up from 32,000 two years ago
- Worldwide vehicle death toll: over one million
- Vehicle deaths and injuries in the U.S. costs over \$70 billion a year.

The Future of Transportation


- Vehicles will be Autonomous (Self-Driving), Connected, Electric and Shared. ACES

Self-Driving Vehicles
