













## **BIG Funding**

#### Typical Funding\*

Tier 1 \$5,000 - \$191,760 Tier 2 \$200,000 - \$1,440,645

\*Tier 2 proposals compete nationally for an average of \$8-\$12 million/year

#### **Project Types**

Development

Renovation

Dredging\*

Education

\* When combined with development activities, not to exceed 10% of the overall project

#### **Grant Limits**

\$500,000 Development

\$500,000 Acquisition

50% Match required\*

\*At least 10% of the match must be non-state, non-federal source


