

### POLICY & ADVOCACY HIGHLIGHTS

We successfully advocated for bills that expand markets for poultry farmers, reduce exposure to neonicitinoid pesticides (with Protect Our Pollinators Coalition), improve conditions for outdoor cannabis growers (with VT Cannabis Equity Coalition), and clarify advocacy groups' ability to file amicus briefs in land use cases, such as Act 250 permits. We also served on the 30x30 agriculture working group, and advocated for a more transparent and democratic process.

We co-hosted our biggest group in recent memory at the Vermont State House for a full and exciting day of advocacy training and testifying.





We returned to Capitol Hill with farmer activists Katie Steere & Gwyneth Harris to advocate for on-farm slaughter with the National Family Farm Coalition. Making progress - news soon!
