## MONTHLY BRIEFING: Town Board Reports

SELECT BOARD

**Masonic Building Committee Presentation** Kris Foss narrated a slide presentation with the committees' considerations and recommendations. The committee studied three paths for the building; repurpose, raze, or move the building. The Committee recommendation is that the building be sold at auction. The auction could package up any additional parcels of land the Town wants to sell. Auctioneer package includes marketing, logistics, legal services/closing. No cost to the town, 10% fee paid by buyer. There would be two options: Option A: Buyer salvages architectural elements and razes the building. The Town funds fill, paving, and land/hardscaping. Cost estimate to the Town of \$60,000. Option B: Buyer moves the building with proceeds from the sale funding the fill, paving, and land/hardscaping. Cost estimate, \$10,000. Recommendation for Town warrant: Approve the sale of the building by auction as outlined above. Raise by taxation the amount of \$110,000 to raze the building, fill, pave, and land/ hardscape if the auction is unsuccessful.

KRSD Budget Update Jim Bibbo, Municipal Budget Committee member, reported that the overall KRSD budget is up 7% for 2023-24. Additionally, all seven schools need new roofs with an estimate of \$6 million. Other systems are in need of replacement and Jim reported that the superintendent has a comprehensive plan for this. Turnback from the 2022-23 budget is about \$200K. For now, KRSD revenues are uncertain. Jim will return at the end of November with more definite numbers.

## **Town Hall Update**

As the year comes to a close, so does the Town Hall Project. Our Town Hall has undergone a magnificent transformation in the past 11 months.

Permanent power was installed in late October which has allowed testing of the sprinkler system, mechanical systems, elevators and alarm systems to move forward. The Fire Marshall and our Fire Chief conducted an inspection of the building and the concerns that were raised are being addressed. The Town's Building Inspector also conducted an inspection.

Painters continue to apply final coats and touch up other spots. Electrical circuits have all been tested. Railings for the accessible ramp and new front entry (on the East side of the building), constructed and donated to the Town by Jason Allen at Merrimack County Customs, have been installed. They beautifully fit the historic

nature of the building.



Once the required testing is complete, the attic has received a layer of blown-in insulation and the outstanding punch list items are addressed, the Certificate of Occupancy will be issued.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with RSA 675:7 that the Bradford Energy Committee will hold a public hearing on Monday, December 4, 2023, at a meeting beginning at 6:00 PM at the Bradford Town Office, 134 East Main Street, Bradford, NH, 03221 to present the proposed 2024 Community Power Project.

The purpose of the hearing is to give Bradford rate payers an opportunity to learn about the community power plan being formed by the Bradford Energy Committee to propose in a warrant article at the 2024 Town Meeting.

The energy committee is pursuing this plan in partnership with Community Power Coalition of NH. To Learn more about community power and the NH Community Power Coalition go to cpcnh.org.

Land Acknowledgement Statement — We are on the unceded land of Nd'akinna which has long served as a site of meeting for Abenaki people from Pagôntegok (Contoocook), O'quasskikonaquan (Newbury) and beyond for thousands of years. Nebizonbik (Bradford Springs) provided healing waters and people exchanged goods at the village site behind Lake Massasecum, calling this land home. The town of Bradford honors, recognizes, and respects these Abenaki, as the traditional stewards of the lands and waters on which we gather today. Fire and EMS incidents: 174 incidents so far in 2023 compared with 186 incidents in 2022. As of November 13: 15 incidents: 9 EMS calls, 6 fire, 2 mutual aid assists to Warner and one station coverage in Newbury.

The Bradford Fire & Rescue stays busy with community events. The Fire department has partnered with Parks and Recreation, the Library and Economic development to kick off the holiday season with the Jingle bus, story time at the library, and a very special guest on December 8 at 5:30pm. The Fire Department will be the pickup and drop-off for the Jingle Bus. We will be filling Bradford's Original Engine #1 with food for the food pantry. The food drive is being done in cooperation with KRES food drive and Bradford Girls on the Run team as they are hosting a toiletry drive to support the local food pantry too.

January 1 stay tuned for more information about the Fire Department partnering with Bradford Parks and Recreation to offer Bradford's Polar Bear plunge at French's Park Beach.

January 4 from 1-5pm we will be hosting a Red Cross Blood drive at the Fire Department. To sign up either go to *RedCrossBlood.org* or contact the Fire Chief at *firechief@bradfordnh.org*.

Winter Storms include a variety of weather, including snow or subfreezing temperatures, strong winds and even ice or heavy rain storms.

The National Weather Service refers to winter storms as the "Deceptive Killers" because most deaths are indirectly related to the storm. People are injured or killed in traffic accidents on icy roads, or suffer from hypothermia due to prolonged exposure to the cold. Winter storms can knock out heat, power and communications, sometimes for days at a time.

**Take Action Before a Winter Storm**Before winter approaches, add supplies to

your emergency kit to prepare for the weather. This may include rock salt to melt ice on walkways, sand to improve traction, snow shovels and other snow removal equipment. Make sure you have adequate clothing and blankets to keep you and your family warm. Consider purchasing a generator to use in the event of prolonged power outages.

Plan ahead for winter travel. Be sure to let someone know where you are going, along with your primary and alternate routes.

Prepare your vehicle for winter by checking, or having your mechanic check, your car. This includes antifreeze levels, battery and ignition systems, breaks, exhaust systems, fuel and air filters, lights, oil, and windshield wipers and fluid.



"Art is not a noun to me; it is a verb", says woodworker Mark Ragonese, the artist in residence at KRES-Bradford who teaches that the creative process exercises the whole mind and body, energetically. His school residencies are

designed to give students a chance to make meaningful objects that both nurture their individuality as well as contribute to endeavors larger than themselves. The KRES-Bradford PTO and the NH State Council on the Arts provided funding for this project.

In November the third, fourth and fifth graders created four large puzzle murals to be installed in the upper elementary hallway. Each piece incorporated suggestions from the students depicting

local landmarks in different seasons: Springtime at Newbury Stonewall, Summer at French's Park, Autumn at Bement Covered Bridge, and Winter at Lake and Mount Sunapee. The school's code of honor was woven into the design, as well.

The kindergarten, first and second graders also made puzzle murals to decorate the primary wing. Theirs featured dynamic poses made from silhouettes of actual students, embracing the theme of Kids in Motion. All of the murals were first fashioned out of wood pieces, then assembled and painted with vibrant base colors, then decorated with stamp prints designed by each child. Mark stresses the importance of individuality, membership in a community, and the significance of the handmade object. He says, "Together we take an idea, experiment, invent, and play until we bring it to creation." Stop by KRES-Bradford and see the engaging and imaginative results of this recent school-wide collaboration.

In celebration of the season, the students of KRES-Bradford will perform at the annual winter concert at KRHS

> on Wednesday. December 6th at 6:30pm. Next, there will be holiday craft workshops after school, led by the PTO, on December 8th and 11th. Finally the students will be treated to the Twelve Books of Bradford, a popular tradition at KRES-Bradford. During the weeks leading up to vacation, classroom teachers will rotate among the classes, reading aloud their

favorite holiday stories, and getting to know their whole school community. Vacation will begin at the end of a full day of school on Friday, December 22nd. Classes will resume on Tuesday. January 2nd, 2024. Best wishes to all for a warm-hearted holiday season.



Ever feel like you want more details on the budget before Town Meeting day? Not able to make Town Meeting but want to know more about town expenses or the budget process? We welcome you to join us either in-person at the Bradford Area Community Center or online (*bradford-nh.org* on landing page, find and click on "Streaming of Certain Meetings", find meeting in "Upcoming").

The Budget Committee will meet on December 14th, and January 11th beginning at 6pm. Agendas are posted in advance on *bradfordnh.org*. Meetings allow us to hear directly from Department Heads, ask questions, and debate budgetary changes. A public hearing will also be held on February 1, 2024, providing anyone interested the opportunity to ask questions and learn more about the budget request.

The Capital Improvement Program (CIP), developed by a subcommittee of the Planning Board, anticipates capital expenses by Department through 2033. CIP-related requests often appear as warrant articles during the Town Meeting. Check-out the CIP plan on the Town's website, bradfordnh.org (Town Boards>Planning Board>Capital Improvement Program). The CIP Committee generally meets August through October and invites your participation. Bradford's Town website provides more information.





### **Christmas Eve at Bradford Center Meetinghouse**

Thirty-five years ago, a few local families decided to reopen the Bradford Center Meetinghouse and bring life back into the building. Regular use of the

Meetinghouse for worship services had ended by 1957 and the site was dormant for several decades. A lightning strike in 1932 had damaged the chimney and rendered the organ mute, but repairs had been made in 1939, so although use of the building had dwindled it

remained intact. The fact that it was never repurposed provides us with the architectural integrity we still see there today.

The annual Christmas Eve Pageant was born in the 1980s out of a desire to teach local children about the origin of the holiday. The event has always been

non-denominational and open to all. At first there were just a few kids and their parents, singing traditional carols a cappella and acting out the Nativity

> scene. Since then, a featured soloist, organ accompaniment, local musicians and a loft choir have been added to the program. Many of the participants are second generation pagenteers.

But, basically, it remains as always... a tableau of adorable children in snowsuit/costumes, eyes shining with anticipa-

### MONTHLY BRIEFING: **Town Board Reports**

**Fire Department** 174 incidents so far in 2023. 186 incidents in 2022. November to date: 15 incidents: 9 EMS calls, 6 fire, 2 mutual aid assists to Warner and one station coverage I Newbury. With invoices outstanding the Fire and Rescue have about 35% of the 2023 budget remaining.

Massasecum Avenue David Hahn and several residents living on Massasecum Avenue appeared to make the Town aware of severe drainage issues on the road. The residents are asking for a reprioritization of tasks to cover the problems on this road. Safety problems primarily include winter drainage and freezing at the intersection of Massasecum Avenue and Route 114. Also, due to draining problems the road in some places is less than one lane. Residents have had to supply material at the end of driveways to be able to enter the road. Steve Hall, present at the meeting, agreed that there is a problem and will investigate.

Signage Complaint George Cilley expressed concern and frustration about ongoing signage at the intersection of Main Street and Route 103. The Board said the Economic Development Committee is working on an ordinance/ regulation.

**Highway Department** The department has about 22% of the budget remaining.

Road Agent Steve Hall has been investigating the Massasecum Avenue repair and has received an initial estimate of \$400k for blasting the ledge. A new body is needed for the 550, 2014 truck costing about \$10k. Steve is looking into options for roadside mowing that include collaborating with Sutton to purchase a mower. Present costs for roadside mowing the whole town are \$15K.

Grant Writer Steve Hall and Chief Bryan Nowell suggest hiring a grant writer to find and write grants. The Board agreed. Steve has heard that there could be some grant money available for the culverts on Deer Valley Road.

Fencing Repair The Board agreed to move forward with fencing at the fire pond and West Main Street costing \$7-10K.

Equipment Sale The Board has authorized the Highway Department to sell a roller and welder.

2024 Town Meeting The Board agreed

to have the meeting at Kearsarge Regional Elementary School at Bradford and voting at the Bradford Area Community Center.

**Funds Received** The Board received \$952

restitution payment for misuse of gas card and \$5,612.13 from NH Saves for reimbursement from the Highway garage weatherization.

**Intent to Cut** Signed for Map 7 Lot 21, and Map 18 Lot 3.

## Easy Saltine Cracker **Toffee**

Super easy Saltine Cracker Toffee, aka Holiday Crack, is the most addictive cookie ever.

#### Ingredients

- 40 salted saltine crackers or enough to line the baking sheet
- 1 cup, 2 sticks unsalted butter
- 1 cup packed light brown sugar
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate
- Topping: 1 cup crunched saltines or chopped nuts or nonpareils or your choice

#### Instructions

- Preheat oven to 400\*
- · Line a baking sheet with parchment paper and line the sheet with saltines.
- In a small saucepan, melt the butter and then add the light brown sugar, stirring to combine. Bring the mixture to a boil and continue boiling for approximately 3 minutes or until the mixture is deep caramel in color. Carefully pour the boiling mixture onto the saltines and spread to cover. A few gaps are okay.
- Bake the saltines in a 350-degree oven for 5 minutes. Remove from the oven and sprinkle chocolate chips over the saltines.
- · Let the toffee sit for a few minutes to allow the chocolate to melt and then spread evenly over the toffee using an offset spatula or a butter knife. Sprinkle the topping on the chocolate and let cool completely.
- Once the toffee has cooled, break apart into pieces and store in an airtight container.

## TRANSFER STATION **CNEWS**

#### A Green Christmas Made Easy

The Bradford Transfer and Recycling Center is abuzz with many ideas to make a green Christmas easy for Bradford's residents. We offer these options.

- · Food Waste: Leave food waste and leftovers on top of the compactor for farm animals. Pigs enthusiastically devour leftovers, especially cookies and pies, and they will have a great Christmas, too! Deposit food waste and leftovers in the clearly-labeled compost container.
- Christmas trees: Give a goat owner a Christmas tree (with decorations stripped from it) as a treat for his goats. Stick a Christmas tree in a snowbank, and hang suet cakes or a bird feeder on it. We will burn Christmas trees when we can safely ignite our burn pile. Please strip all decorations from trees left to be burned.
- Live table decorations that you choose to discard such as poinsettias, flower bouquets, and potted plants (stripped of their metallic decorations) should be put in the compost contain-
- Regular wrapping paper (non metallic and non-foil wrapping paper) should be put in the mixed paper baler. Metallic and foil wrapping, ribbons, and bows are trash and should be put in the municipal waste compactor.

#### **Sweet Beet – KRES-B Three Sisters**



For many Native Americans, corn, squash, and beans are known as the "Three Sisters". They are sisters because they grow in close quarters and help each other: corn provides a pole for beans to climb; beans fix nitrogen in the soil for their sister plants; and squash leaves shade out weeds.

In the fall of 2022, the Kearsarge Food Hub launched a program that focuses on the Three Sisters for Bradford elementary school's third graders. Now in its second year, the program consists of four field trips to Food Hub fields on Henniker Road for planting and harvesting. This program allows these young children to build off of their experiences with the Kearsarge Food Hub as first graders, where they plant garlic cloves in the fall and plant and harvest salad greens to feed their classmates in the spring.

For each field trip, the third graders and teachers walked the fields to meet outdoors with the "Three Sisters" educators, Julie Loosigian, a farm educator from Sweet Beet Farm (a program of the Kearsarge Food Hub), and Lynn Clowes, a community member and educator of Abenaki and MicMac heritage and member of an Abenaki tribe. The program is part of the Abenaki Seeds Project, a collaborative effort of the Abenaki Trails project, the Kearsarge Food Hub, the Hopkinton Historical Society, Warner Public Market, and Colby-Sawyer

College to distribute Abenaki heritage seeds to growers in the Kearsarge area and support food security for Abenaki neighbors through donated produce.

Enthusiastic participants in the program, the children did a fantastic job planting, tending, discussing, observing, and harvesting the Three Sisters. Lynn taught the children a song written by a tribal member, which teaches the Abenaki words for please (liulaldamana), thank you (olioni), you're welcome (onda kagwi), and excuse me (anhaldamaway). The children played Native American games between planting duties. They also heard Abenaki and other Native American stories, learned about the interconnectedness of the systems of nature that support them, and learned a Native American way to show respect by offering a tobacco prayer tie to elders and people who are knowledge carriers.

In the end they grew and donated more than 50lbs of Abenaki Crookneck Squash (tastes like butternut), 8lbs of Abenaki Cranberry Beans (a tasty round maroon bean, good for baking), and 7lbs of Rose Flint Corn kernels to the Abenaki Helping Abenaki food pantry. The harvest field trip when the children shucked the beans and corn was particularly lively, and every child went home with a few bright beans and rosy kernels of corn. Many pleaded for more




