Music Memories sessions

Music Memories sessions use music and singing to help people tell their stories and express themselves. We deliver sessions in care homes and other community settings. We have a number of 'open' sessions where anybody is welcome to come and join in:

- **St. Bride's** every Monday 10.45-11.45am (St. Brides Centre, 10 Orwell Terrace, EH11 2DZ)
- **St. Cuthbert's** 1st & 3rd Monday of the month 2.00-3.00pm (St Cuthbert's Episcopal Church, Colinton Road, EH13 0BB)
- **Ashbrook** 1st & 3rd Friday of the month 11.00-12.00 (Ashbrook, 492 Ferry Road, EH5 2DL)

Our Music Memories Project is constantly evolving and growing. Seeing staff and those cared for singing together demonstrates how music can enhance these relationships: staff providing care are offered a different way of seeing and interacting with people they are supporting, while those receiving care can find a sense of balance and power in these relationships that they may not find in other forms of communication. Come along to an open session if you can!

Together in Song

Together in Song is a monthly concert held at the Festival Theatre. We work in partnership with the team at Capital Theatres to run this as part of their Dementia Friendly Programme. Each month has a theme and often features interviews to help us get to know each other better. In October 2023 we were joined by the cast of Sister Act, including Lesley Joseph. We had a wonderful hour singing together and even made it on to <u>STV news</u>!
