TALENT IS EVERYWHERE; OPPORTUNITY IS NOT

We founded SpringForward Ventures to create highquality jobs for individuals with emotional or behavioral health needs who face barriers to employment. The nonprofit was established by PHILLIPS Programs knowing that most of our graduates need a new type of workplace in order to thrive. The companies SpringForward Ventures incubate will be built on our innovative, human-centered EVERY Employee™ framework. To go beyond job creation, SpringForward also generates personal and community wealth by providing a pathway to employee ownership for a population that is often kept in poverty by design.

The IRS approved our 501(c)(3) status as a tax-exempt charitable organization in August 2022. Since then, SpringForward has raised \$2.5 million and is seeking an additional \$2.5 million for our first two social enterprises: SpringForward Farms, a self-sustaining hydroponic growing facility in Baltimore; and SpringForward Feeds, a meal service company that will operate out of the commercial kitchen at PHILLIPS School ~ Annandale.

Support for SpringForward Farms includes a \$250,000 USDA Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production Grant to be used for construction of a four-bay hightech greenhouse that will provide future-focused career

opportunities in in urban agriculture.

We also are working with Johns Hopkins University's Bloomberg School of Public Health, which developed the Baltimore Urban Food Distribution (BUD) app to connect local farmers with corner stores in the city. The first test of this partnership was a big success with three stores in East Baltimore receiving regular deliveries of leafy greens grown by SpringForward and we look forward to expanding to more stores.

Another important partnership is SpringForward moving us closer to the opening of

SpringForward Feeds. We teamed up with Brigaid, an organization founded by Dan Giusti, the former head chef at Noma in Copenhagen, which was hailed as "the best restaurant in the world." Together, we brought in acclaimed chef Ben Pflaumer who is scaling our meal production business. In addition to supporting professional development for Culinary Arts students and staff, he is giving our school meals a delicious, nutritious makeover, which reduces food waste and fights dietrelated illnesses.



Family Partners helps families stay together and grow together by delivering home- and community-based counseling, behavior intervention, and parent education. Our expert team of mental health professionals, Board Certified Behavior Analysts, and behavior technicians provides comprehensive behavior and mental health services for struggling families. This includes intensive home-based counseling, school avoidance interventions, Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT) for young children experiencing behavioral difficulties, and Strong Families parenting classes conducted in collaboration with Arlington County. We are pleased to have resumed Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) services in Northern Virginia to help children manage challenging behaviors and build needed skills.

Family Partners raised more than \$100,000 in 2022 with grants from The Morris & Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation, Crescent Cities Charities, and the American Rescue Plan Act.

DIGITAL DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

We are proud to have received support from Autism Speaks for our new Earn and Learn Fellowships in Digital Design and Technology.

These paid fellowships are designed to help young adults with neurodiversity gain the experience and build the skills they need to pursue their career dreams.

Autism Speaks provided funding for seven-week summer fellowships for three young men at our Innovation/Opportunity Lab in Fairfax.

The program provided group and one-on-one lessons and learning opportunities for fellows to develop technical skills in information technology and 3D design and printing. It also focused on development of social skills and good work habits. All three fellows gained technical and soft skills, increased self-confidence, and made meaningful social connections among peers and with program staff.
