

## REFLECTIONS

As I wrap up nearly a decade in the leadership of the Land Trust, I want to share highlights from what we have accomplished together.

We serve the fast-growing region of Gorham, Gray, Standish, Westbrook, and Windham, which over 75,000 people call home, and a quarter of a million people live in surrounding Greater Portland. This region has some of the lowest rates of conserved land in the country. We have made great strides in our commitment to expanding open space, protecting clean water, providing vital wildlife habitat, and ensuring access to nature.

Thanks to an exponential growth in support by families living throughout the region, in the last decade, we tripled the acres of land we have forever conserved to nearly 3,000 acres while also tripling the miles of trails to over 30 miles that are free and open to the public. This support has also enabled us to grow our capacity to three staff members who organize hundreds of volunteers and ensure we can provide ongoing educational programming, protect wildlife habitat, and maintain a quality trail system.



42% Conservation (\$139K)


17% Stewardship: Land and Wildlife (\$55K)
