Enterprise in the Life Sciences Challenge 2021

An exclusive opportunity for Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic Students in the School of Life Sciences

In the autumn of 2021, Careers & Employability and The School of Life Sciences joined up to launch the 'Enterprise in the Life Sciences Challenge'. The programme was created following a successful bid to the Student, Success and Innovation Fund (SIFF) supporting projects that aim to address experience, or employment gaps, for, and in partnership with, Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic students.

An Enterprising Mindset

The two-week challenge offered a unique platform for Life Sciences students to connect with employers across the sector. They were introduced to key concepts of entrepreneurial activity and creative problem solving with an Enterprise Educator and tackled issues faced by organisations in the Pharmaceutical, Health Technology, Animal & Ecology, and Medical Communication sectors. Take up across the school was fantastic, with 8 teams of students across first to final years completing the challenge and creating digital pitches to showcase their solutions to employers.

Developing Skills and Professional Networks

Feedback from the employers was that students were engaged, passionate and creative, and some employers have decided to implement student ideas to tackle real issues within their organisations! It was a truly collaborative approach between academics, students, the Careers and Employability Team that has allowed students to build their professional networks, developing a range of skills that are in demand in the Life Sciences and wider graduate labour market. Hear first-hand from some of the students involved on the benefits of taking part and how they have enhanced their employability:
