


As a team member, you will meet the artists as they deliver their work


Greetings from the Artist Within!





ABOUT THOSE ANNOYING SCAMS

At the dinner hour, the land-line telephone we still maintain often rings to warn us that some kind soul at Amazon has had to flag an unusual purchase, and all we have to do is provide our banking information for them to reverse the charges. A similar call, often early in the morning when we're still half asleep, is from a benevolent party at the *Canada Revenue Agency*, warning us that unpaid taxes mean we are soon to be arrested by the RCMP. Another regular caller is an important-sounding representative from *Microsoft*, informing us that our computer has been infected with a destructive virus and we must take corrective action immediately or all of our files, accounts and data will be corrupted. A couple of people we know, have received urgent calls from errant grandchildren and children requesting bail money. And there are also the bi-weekly check-ins from a call centre far away to offer us a great deal on duct cleaning.

Having grown weary of the constant assault of such scams, I have done a little research. The following outlines some useful information I have gleaned and some important websites for all of us to be aware of. I am by no means an expert on these matters, but I hope that my notes help us all to be a little more aware and cautious.

The following website Identify a scam or fraud | ontario.ca brings

you to a *Government of Ontario* website for identifying scams or frauds. The website has some very useful information. Scams are schemes attempting to trick people into sharing personal, financial information and/or money. These typically begin with the scammer utilizing a little bit of information about you and pretending to be someone you know or someone from a company or service that you utilize. I recently had a call from PayPal informing me of a problem with my account information. I hung up the phone and called PayPal directly only to discover, as I suspected, that there was nothing amiss with my account information and I had been contacted by a scammer. In order to protect yourself, always call your contact back directly through normal channels when you receive a suspicious phone call.

There are several different types of scams that we should all be aware of, and most of them involve **phishing** (fishing) to some degree – using whatever information is readily available about you to establish enough trust so that they can solicit more. Besides the annoying telephone scammer phone calls, there are at least six other such scams that we should know something about. These definitions come from the *Government of Ontario* website:

Hyperlinks – you are asked to select a hyperlink that takes you to a website that gathers personal details about you such as interests and recent online activity.

Text (SMS) – you receive a text message from a scammer that asks for your financial and personal information through text messaging

are asked by text to click a link that takes you to a website, in order to collect your financial and personal information (i.e., full name, date of birth, banking/credit card information).

Telephone – you receive a phone call from a scammer enticing you to give them financial and personal information. In many cases, these scammers have a sense of urgency or tell you that you need to act immediately.

Email – you receive an email from a scammer impersonating a known institution or business with a hyperlink or downloadable document that is designed to collect your financial and personal information. These are often very convincing, complete with letterhead, photographs and graphics snagged from the original.

Social media – you receive messages on social media platforms pretending to be customer support asking you to share financial and personal information.

QR codes – you receive a QR code, usually by email, that takes you to a malicious website designed to collect your financial and personal information.

Warning signs to be aware of when you are contacted by someone requesting money, or personal or financial information:

They may attempt to exert pressure, asking you, with great urgency, to make a quick decision or something terrible will happen;

They may request privacy, asking you not to share information with the authorities or others;

They may request gift cards or bit coin or prepaid credit cards (this is a common one – we have received

emails allegedly from friends on holiday, requesting gift cards);

The request for financial or personal information comes with a link or attachment to an unknown sender.

Some recommended best practices, include:

Protect yourself by ignoring emails from unknown senders;

Never open attachments from someone you don't know;

Never follow links to sites or individuals you don't know;

Remember that legitimate websites encrypt confidential information and details;

Look at the web address – it should read https and not http;

Never send confidential information over email or text;

Change your passwords regularly and keep them confidential;

Utilize a reputable software program that helps to block untrustworthy sites;

Never provide confidential information on the phone unless you have called back to the institution to verify the caller.

If you think you have been victimized by a scammer, here are some suggestions:

Stop all communications immediately;

Update all accounts and passwords, including social media sites;

Notify your bank and other financial institutions immediately;

Report the scam to the Police and the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre.
