America. He is highly sought after for his romance and western paperback covers. Some of his cover art can be seen on Pinterest and he has illustrated well over 600 book covers to date. Paperback illustration enabled Albert to paint portraits and figures in a variety of landscapes and indoor settings, as well as create masterful compositions in a myriad of lighting situations. Hence, paving the way for a career in portraiture.

His big break came in 2003, being only one of three Canadians to be commissioned by the USPS, to paint portraits of celebrities on commemorative postage stamps, featuring celebrities like Marian Anderson, Spencer Tracy, Betty Davis, Barbara Jordan, Paul Robeson and Countee Cullen.






A Work in Progress

by Albert Slark (as published in ArtScene Nov 2023)







STEP ONE: DRAWING THE PORTRAIT

This is the most important step of portrait painting.

- I make a simplified drawing on paper of my subject – known as a construct
- I block in the head which is almost a profile
- I draw in the large masses and shadow shapes, the features, neck line and hair with HB and 2B pencils NO shading
- I then transfer it on to canvas.

STEP TWO: MONOCHROME UNDER-PAINTING

After the drawing is fixed with fixative and thoroughly dry

- I tone the canvas with a light umber wash, using mineral sprits and oil paint
- Once dry I then proceed to ink the drawing with the same umber paint and block in my shadow shapes, features hair etc, and work out all the details at this stage.

STEP THREE: DEADCOLOUR

Deadcolouring is basically the second application of paint using the fat over lean principle, (no medium is used ie lindseed oil) just paint applied fairly thinly so the underpainting is not obscured.

- I mix a basic flesh tone (very low chroma) using Cad red light, yellow ochre mixed with Titanium white with a touch of Cerulean blue
- The background colour and sweater is blocked in.



Going for the finish. Once the painting is dry to the touch, I start with the shadows, mixed with Burnt Umber, Cad Red and Mauve from the sweater, next the half tone, same flesh colour as step 3 mixed with some background colour, the lights: same flesh tone with more white, and cad yellow pale and lastly the high lights, white and a touch of cad yellow.

- Once that's all blocked in I start with the eyes, nose, mouth, ears and hair.
- The finishing touches, accents, glazing and scumbling (dry brush with opaque paint).
