What can I do before the course starts?

Here are some things you could consider working on before the start of the course. These are optional and we encourage you to take these ideas and work with them in a way that motivates you.

Start a sketchbook

We suggest having a sketchbook so that you can start sketching shapes and design ideas. Don't worry, this will not be assessed! It's just a great way of capturing your ideas on paper and will get you thinking like a jeweller. You may want to have a small sketchbook that you can carry around with you or a larger one to have at home to work on. If you prefer a digital solution do have a look at drawing apps for your phone or tablet.

Start a creativity journal

Buy a notebook and start to write about the things that catch your eye. That could be fashion, nature, architecture, food - anything goes! It's also useful to journal about how you feel about your creativity; anything you're excited about, what you're anxious of, things that come up for you. By writing them down it can help you process your thoughts. If this is an approach that you're interested in do take a look at The Artist's Way by Julia Cameron.

Look at the work of jewellers

It is a good idea to look at the work of jewellers to see what appeals to you, what you don't like etc. Instagram is a great place to start for this. If you search using hashtags like #jewelry #jewellery #silverjewellery #finejewellery etc you'll start to discover new jewellers.

What can I do before the course starts?

Collect images that inspire you

Cut out pictures from magazines or find images online. These could be images of jewellery but it's also good to keep your inspiration more wide. Finding the things that inspire you is what is going to help you develop your own style of design eventually once you've learnt the skills.

Consider starting a board on Pinterest to keep images and links that inspire you so you can go back to them when you're ready.

Start an Instagram account

Whether you already have Instagram or not now is a great time to start an account to share your jewellery journey. If you want to set up your own jewellery business then doing this now is a great opportunity to connect with potential customers. If you would like to work for another jeweller then your Instagram account will act like an online portfolio of your development.

Start a Facebook account

If you already have a login for Facebook then you can tick this off your list! If you don't we do strongly suggest that you set one up even if it is just to access the Diploma Facebook page. The support there is important to access plus if you do start your own business Facebook is a great place to advertise your jewellery. If you are concerned about privacy you can do the following:

- Input as little information as possible. They do not allow you to use a fake name because of anti-bullying laws but you can put in a fake date of birth and can skip most information they ask for e.g. the school you went to.
- Set up two factor authentication so that no one can change your password without you knowing.
