
2. Respect


Respect is represented by the Buffalo

We must always speak from a truthful place. You can lie to yourself and believe your own lie. It is important not to deceive yourself.


4. Humility


5. Bravery



6. Honesty




Honesty is represented by the raven. The raven recognizes and accepts who it is and allows truth to be its guide.
