GREETINGS FROM PASTOR JEFF!

Luke 4:16 “*And Jesus came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. And as was His custom, He went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and He stood up to read.*” Jesus had a routine to His life, a flow which included going to the synagogue to worship on the Sabbath. He did this even when he was travelling. And the prophet, Daniel, prayed three times daily, even the threat of death could not persuade him to change such an important routine (**Dan. 6:10**). Life is a mixture of the routine and the new thing.

Summer is a special time of new things with vacations, mission trips, picnics, outdoor concerts, and other events. I’ve been out of my routine lately with serving at Camp Calvin Crest, a couple weeks vacation, and then the Intergenerational Mission Trip to Hidden Acres Christian Center in Iowa. Getting out of our routine is good for periods of time. In fact, God reminds us through the prophet Isaiah that He does new things, **Isaiah 43:19** “*Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?*”

Perhaps one of the great reasons to do new things is not just for the excitement and finding better things that you may enjoy, but it also helps you appreciate the regular routines of life. After a period of being out of my routine for an extended time, I am always glad to get back into the regular swing of things. Having some predictability to the day and doing those things you enjoy regularly has merit. Routine can increase our efficiency and ensure that we do not overlook important things (like taking medicine at the same time each day).

In the end, routine can work for us or against us. We must make sure that doing new things does not break the critically important routines of life (like worshipping the Lord as our Lord Jesus Himself modelled). On the other hand, there is legitimate danger in falling into ruts which rob us of vitality and cause us to begrudge others doing new things. Remember God does new things!

So, take time to do some new things, but also pay attention to the important routine of life. **Isaiah 42:10** “*Sing to the Lord a new song, His praise from the end of the earth.*”

Well, we are in the midst of searching for a new Director of Student Ministries as Caroline moves back to Minnesota, and a new Choir Director, as Alice steps away from that role. We wish them well in their future endeavors and ask God’s blessings to be upon them. Please pray for spiritual discernment for the teams interviewing for the new people who will fulfill these roles that we would be blessed by their service to the Lord through Good Shepherd.

Faith in Action hosted an excellent mission trip to Hidden Acres Christian Center in Iowa. I was moved by the caring, positive, Christian attitudes of the staff and kids at the camp. It really is a neat place, and we got much work done for them and the Lord. The team is planning to make a presentation of the trip through worship on August 19.

Faith in Action is also hosting a Spiritual Retreat Friday, **September 21st through Sunday September 23rd**. I hope you will give this opportunity to refresh and grow friendships and strengthen your connection to God through this retreat. It is just one weekend but can make a great difference in your life. This is not a mission work weekend, but a time of fellowship and renewal. If you have questions please see Chris Hartley.

Also, as I write I am about one week away from my ten-year anniversary with Good Shepherd. Here are the numbers: 34 baptisms, 12 marriages, 84 new members (some of whom have already passed away), approximately 500 worship services, over 100 communion runs to the homebound, ten times Christmas caroling, eleven Vacation Bible Schools, many mission trips, and countless other events. There are the projects we have worked on together, planning the mission trips, and working through challenges. But more importantly are the relationships built over this time through shared experiences. As with anything involving people over long periods, there are ups and downs, but there have been many more ups than downs for me. It has been an honor to walk with so many during important transitions in life like marriage and confirmation, but even more so to walk with our dear saints who have approached and gone on to their reward. I know we will meet again face to face and that is an encouragement. So, thank you and may God continue to bless you and me (sometimes in surprising ways) and Good Shepherd (also sometimes in surprising ways).

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

SCHOOL BAG PATTERN

MATERIALS NEEDED: 1/2 yd. "Kid-friendly" Fabric

MAKE THE BAG: • Cut two pieces of fabric 13" X 17"

- Place the two pieces together, right sides together, and sew a 1/2" seam down one side, across the bottom, and up the other side, leaving the top open.
- Turn the bag so the seam is in the inside.
- Turn under 1/2" on the top edge and press.
- Turn under 2" at the top edge to form a hem and stitch.



MAKE THE HANDLES: • Cut two pieces of fabric 4" X 22"

- Fold in half one of the 4" X 22" pieces with right sides together. Stitch with a 1/2" seam allowance and turn inside out, or turn under and press 1/2" on long side of fabric. Fold wrong sides together. Top stitch close to edge. Press. Repeat for the second handle. Press.
- Turn under raw edges and stitch to the top of the bag.

Finished bag will be approximately 12" X 14". Place school items in bag.

Canvas tote bags can also be used. Inexpensive canvas bags are available at area craft and discount stores. Tote bags can also be purchased online at www.myshopangel.com

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

Nomination of Church Officers

It is not too early to start thinking about serving! We ask you to join us in praying for the Lord's guidance and discernment in providing a slate for election.

According to our Presbyterian Book of Order, "Elders should be persons of faith, dedication and good judgment. Their manner of life should be a demonstration of the Christian gospel, both within the church and in the world. Together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, they exercise leadership, government and discipline, and have responsibilities for the life of a particular church as well as the church at large including ecumenical relationships" (Book of Order, G-6.0300).

Deacons are to be "Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, of exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, warm sympathies, and sound judgment. The office of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of sympathy, witness, and service after the example of Jesus Christ" (Book of Order G-6.0400).

Our Church Bylaws (10.05) provide for a Foundation Board to "ask for contributions and bequests on behalf of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church" and to "administer funds received and make recommendations to the Session on expenditures."

Your Nominating Team for 2019 include Joni Calkins, Tory Ford, David Hanselmann, Connie Hilligoss, Georgia Raecke, Laura Warrick & Pastor Jeff Warrick (ex officio).

My family and I have been enjoying the TV series *Forged In Fire* where contestants compete to see who can create the best forged weapon according to the given specifications.


That's probably why when our family camping trip, volunteering at my church's VBS, and preparing for a work event all fell on the same day, the following

phrase came to mind: Don't have too many irons in the fire!

It means we shouldn't take on more than we can handle and it came straight from the blacksmith's shop. If there were too few irons in the fire, the blacksmith would have to wait for some to heat up and couldn't stay constantly busy. If he had too many, he couldn't keep up with them and he would be labeled inefficient. Having just the right amount of irons in the fire was the sign of a good blacksmith and allowed the smithy to keep up a steady pace of work.

It comes down to balance, which is often found through trial and error. I encourage you to examine your list of responsibilities as I examine mine. If your forge is overflowing and irons are being neglected maybe it's time to pull out one or two. However, if you feel your time and talents are going to waste from disuse, it may be time to stir up the fire and get ready to grasp hold of the opportunities at hand.
