

2023 BPRA Annual Meeting and Elections – What is the Same, What has Changed?

We will follow the same basic Annual Meeting and voting procedures as we did in 2020, 2021 and 2022, with several notable exceptions resulting from the end of the COVID-19 State of Emergency. A summary is below and continues on page 9. A detailed explanation of the COVID era elections rules, the emergency authorizations they were based on, the changes



resulting from the end of the State of Emergency and the BPRA's proposed plans to update our Governing Documents to allow for electronic meetings and mail-in ballots for future meetings can be found on page 10.

Meeting on Zoom - Same Procedure as 2020, 2021, 2022

The SBPCA and BPRA Annual Meetings will again be held on Zoom this year.

Ballots – Same Procedure as 2020, 2021, 2022

The 2023 BPRA Board of Trustee Elections will be held via mail-in or drop-off ballot. Ballots and proxy envelopes will be mailed to each member household with the Annual Meeting Notice in October. Election instructions and additional information can be found on the reverse side of the ballot, and at StrathmoreBelPre.org.

Establishing Quorum – Same Procedure as 2020, 2021, 2022

Proxies Are Needed!

For the BPRA to do business, such as elect BPRA Board Trustees and adopt a By-laws amendment, at the Annual Meeting, we must establish a quorum of at least 72 households, which is10% of member households. **Quorum can be established by proxy**, so it is important that each member household complete and return the proxy envelope included in the Annual Meeting mailing before **November 16**th.

Completing and returning the proxy allows your household to be counted as "present" by proxy for purposes of establishing quorum at the 2023 Annual Meeting and any continuances thereof. Members attending the meeting on Zoom also will be considered present for establishing quorum. If we do not meet quorum requirements at the **November 16**th meeting, then the election and By-Laws voting portion of the annual meeting will be adjourned. The meeting will reconvene as an additional meeting on Tuesday, **December 5**, at 8:00 p.m., via teleconference on Zoom, where the quorum will be either 36 households (under the BPRA By-Laws), or those in attendance on Zoom or by proxy (under the Maryland Homeowners Association Act § 11B-111(6)).



Election of BPRA Board Trustees (change in procedure from 2020, 2021, 2022)

Only ballots submitted by members who **also attend** the Zoom meeting may be counted.

A detailed explanation about why this has changed can be found on page 10. The proposed By-laws amendment will allow mail in/drop-off ballots, meaning all properly completed and timely returned

ballots can be counted whether or not a member attends a virtual Annual Meeting. See below and <u>page 10</u> for more information about the proposed by-laws amendment.

Election Results

Election results will not be available at the Annual Meeting but will be posted on <u>StrathmoreBelPre.org</u> and at the pool within approximately one week of the completion of the election.



We encourage all members to attend the November 16th Annual Meeting on Zoom and we urge all households, whether they plan on attending the meeting or not, to complete and return the proxy envelope. Doing so helps us meet quorum requirements and shows your support for the Association to conduct business at the Annual Meeting.

Proposed By-Law Amendment

At the November 16, 2023, BPRA Annual Meeting, the membership will be voting on the adoption of a BPRA by-laws amendment. This amendment authorizes the BPRA Board of Trustees to hold electronic meetings and authorizes mail-in/drop-off ballots for the BPRA elections and other BPRA business that requires a vote by the membership. The proposed amendment essentially codifies the procedures we used, under emergency authorization, in 2020, 2021, and 2022, for virtual/electronic meetings and mail-in/drop-off ballots for BPRA elections. 2023 BPRA Annual Meeting Changes

Background

The Commission on Common Ownership Communities (CCOC) is the Montgomery County Government agency that oversees all homeowners' associations (HOAs), condominium associations, and housing co-ops in Montgomery County. The Bel Pre Recreational Association (BPRA) is our HOA. In 2020, because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the CCOC issued emergency directives authorizing home-owners' associations to hold meetings and elections that were not in-person — even if an association's governing documents normally required that they be done in-person. Based on these directives (issued March 6 and April 2, 2020), the BPRA Board adopted an amendment to the BPRA Plan of Organization whereby the annual general membership meetings for 2020, 2021, and 2022 were held on Zoom, using mail-in ballots for voting.

The CCOC has now taken the position that, since the President, Governor, and County Executive have all declared that the states of emergency have ended, the Commission no longer has the authority to waive in-person requirements of homeowners' association by-laws. Therefore, the BPRA can no longer use those CCOC directives as authority to have the annual meeting on Zoom and to vote by mail.

The State Legislature, however, enacted a new section to the Maryland Homeowners Association Act (§ 11B-113.6) in 2021 that authorizes HOAs to hold meetings by Zoom or by other electronic means, notwithstanding any contrary language contained in the governing documents of the HOA. The statute, however, only authorizes counting of the ballots of members who actually attend the electronic meeting. As a result, when we use the new state statute to authorize our annual membership meeting being held on Zoom, only ballots submitted by members who attend the Zoom meeting may be counted.

Plans for the 2023 Annual Meeting

Because the BPRA By-Laws do not authorize electronic meetings, the Maryland Homeowners Association Act provision is the only authorization that can be used by the BPRA to hold its 2023 Annual General Membership Meeting on Zoom.

While state law authorizes us to hold our annual meeting on Zoom this year, we must follow our current BPRA By-Laws regarding proxies and ballots. Our By-laws allow for proxies to be used to meet the General Membership meeting quorum requirements. Our ballots also are required to be by secret ballot. Our Plan of Organization (§ 405) provides the mechanics for how ballots for the election of trustees have been distributed, mailed-in or dropped-off, and counted.

Only the ballots of members who actually **attend this year's annual meeting on Zoom**, however, will be counted, due to a requirement found in the Maryland Homeowners Association Act provision authorizing HOAs to hold an electronic meeting.

Spark Bird

Many people who enjoy watching and/or feeding birds can tell a tale of a particular bird or circumstance that piqued their interest above the casual. That spark bird awakened a need to know more.

Often, the bird that sparks the interest is a common backyard bird. For Roger Tory Peterson, whose illustrated field guide inspired and aided millions of us, it was a northern flicker that led him to believe that "birds are the most vivid reflection of life."



Bird artist DIANE FORD illustrated our SBP Birdathon reports during the pandemic. She told me that as a little girl, she saw a pair of bluejays in her backyard. "Their color and flair awed me," she said. She's been drawing birds (and selling paintings) ever since. This is her quick sketch of a sassy jay.



Sometimes a bird's behavior captures our attention. Sharon and Steed Edwards have several feeders in their SBP yard. Sharon has "an affinity" for the hummingbirds. They are "so independent, so protective of their home turf, combative at times, and unpredictable ... but fun to observe!"

Her husband Steed appreciates the goldfinches. "Their color, once they turn, really brightens up the feeders!" Male goldfinches will change into their drab winter plumage soon, but will stay with us to feast on sunflower and nyger (thistle) seeds at our feeders through the cold weather. The males will "turn yellow" again in the spring.

Jackie Fary-Moeller, our local Scout leader, says that for her, the catalyst was a Carolina wren. She decided she needed to know what that very cute and common bird was. That led to "a grand realization that I had very little idea of what the plants and animals all around me were, so it was kind of part of a whole mission to learn more and be able to identify the life in my neighborhood."

Strangely enough, my spark bird was also a Carolina wren. Sometimes a sound fits into things in a new way and becomes a real "ear-opener." I was familiar with wrens' perky personalities, but did not suspect that the loud trill I heard in my backyard came from



that tiny bird. When a birder friend identified it, a whole new world of interconnected sight and sound opened up.

Learning something new about a "common" bird proved to be both startling and addictive. I was hooked—and happy. An awakened interest in birds, a change of focus, can reveal so many connections: the connection of birds to the universe, the connection of the universe to us.

What about 2024 and beyond?

To enable the BRPA to use mail-in/drop-off ballots for elections in future annual meetings – where every mail-in/drop-off ballot completed and returned in a timely fashion is counted – now requires a change in the BPRA By-Laws.

Amendments to the BPRA By-Laws require the approval by the General Membership at an Annual Meeting. At its October 3 meeting, the BPRA Board approved forwarding to the General Membership a proposed amendment to the BPRA By-Laws. The By-Laws amendment would authorize the General Membership, the Board, and the BPRA committees to hold meetings by video conferencing or other electronic means. It would also authorize the use of mail-in/drop-off ballots for votes at any General Membership meeting, not just the Annual General Membership meeting.

Amendments to the BPRA By-Laws go into effect 30 days after they are adopted by the General Membership. Thus, a proposed amendment to the By-Laws adopted at the 2023 meeting would take effect **December 16**, if it is approved at the **November 16** General Membership meeting.

Pay Online? Yes!

In 2023, we had a significant increase in online assessment payments. We encourage you to pay your annual assessment online with a credit card through our eSoft Planner portal. Paying online saves our volunteers countless hours of data entry and check processing time, reduces our use of paper, reduces data entry errors, and lets members get set up for pool check in at the time of assessment payment.

You can pay your BPRA Assessment, join the Civic Association (SBPCA), donate to the Pet Waste Station Fund, and donate to the SBP Dolphins swim team all in one place. (We understand that having to do a separate transaction for each of these is a bit frustrating. We have requested a "Shopping Cart" feature to allow one payment transaction for all enrollments. We anticipate having this function in place for the 2025 assessment payment.)

Online payments for 2024 will be available no later than **February 1, 2024**. Payment by mailed paper check will still be an option.

A Look Ahead – Join the Swim Team







What is The Purpose/Mission of Glenmont Exchange?

The Glenmont Exchange grew out of the 2012 community meetings for the Glenmont Sector Plan. Those meetings forged new connections across the community. It was useful that we talked with each other. We exchanged perspectives and insights, enlightening all of us. We created the Glenmont Exchange as a forum to continue those connections. The name Glenmont *Exchange* reflects that purpose.



SBP Food Trucks?

To date, the most requested social event indicated on the SBP Village Social Activities Survey is Food Trucks. Village Volunteer Program

In addition to providing activities that increase social engagement, wellness, and education, SBP Village plans to develop a neighbor -helping-neighbor support system. This volunteer component will help address SBP Village's other two goals of offering a sense of purpose and a sense of support for neighborhood residents. The next edition of *The Bugle* should have information about this upcoming volunteer initiative.



SBP Village will again be requesting neighbor input, this time concerning potential areas of need within the community. The Village will also be working with new county partners to access official volunteer training, background checks, and other resources to support our endeavors.

County Assistance for SBP Village

To help fulfill our pledge to remain a dues-free village, SBP Village has looked outside our neighborhood for sources of assistance. Montgomery County's Department of Health and Human Services allocates funds to assist budding villages like ours.

SBP Village Partners with other Villages

SBP Village also joined together with seven other more established Montgomery County villages. Working together, the group decided to form a consortium, and set about establishing its legal status. The consortium's board of directors worked with a nonprofit lawyer to register the Montgomery County Villages Consortium, Inc. in the State of Maryland. Paperwork then was filed in September with the IRS so that the Consortium can become a recognized 501(c)(3) nonprofit charitable organization. As such, the consortium and its villages will be eligible for grant funding as well as tax-deductible donations. In fact, the consortium has already applied for and been awarded grants from the state of Maryland and Montgomery County.

SBP Village and Montgomery County Villages Consortium Together

SBP Village will be using the Montgomery County Villages Consortium as our fiscal sponsor. We will remain an independent village, but we will not be separately incorporated, or have our own charitable status. We will use the tax status of the consortium, and will benefit from contracting with it and participating in some of its programs,. The Consortium lawyer anticipates the IRS process to be completed in the spring. This is a precursor to SBP Village obtaining liability insurance, a requirement necessary to launch our volunteer program in earnest. Status updates should be available in March.

County and State are Applying for a Federal Grant to Study Georgia Avenue Improvements
Back in May, Governor Wes Moore visited Wheaton for a safety walk along Georgia Avenue with
Montgomery County Councilmember Natali Fani-Gonzalez. After follow-up meetings with Moore
Administration staff, the Maryland Department of Transportation and the Montgomery County Government
are working together to apply for a Federal DOT grant under the Community Connection Plan, part of the
Inflation Reduction Act. If awarded, the grant will study pedestrian, bicycle, and transit needs within the
Georgia Avenue corridor from Forest Glen Road to Layhill Road, and identify public infrastructure
improvements around the Wheaton Metro Station.

The grant only funds the study to identify needs. Later work would develop alternatives to address those needs which would advance into the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process. The NEPA process is extensive and offers many future opportunities for public input before any implementation decisions are made. Our Strathmore Bel Pre Civic Association issued a letter supporting the award of grant funds for this study.

Project Porchlight was created as part of <u>Montgomery Energy Connection</u>, a program of Montgomery County to help homeowners use less energy and recycle their CFL light bulbs correctly. The porch is often the entryway into your home, the first point of contact for you to start using less energy.

In November, (11/4,11/5, 11/11, 11/12), Energy Ambassadors will be going door to door in our neighborhood, to install the LED bulbs on our porches. If you are not home, they will leave information for you to make the switch. Also, if you have any CFL bulbs in your home that you would like to recycle right, please collect them and have them ready for the Energy Ambassadors to recycle for you. They will give you 1 LED bulb per 3 CFL bulbs.

Lighting accounts for around 12% of an average home's electricity use. By switching to LED light bulbs, you can save about \$225 in energy costs per year.
