Secure the scene. Get any witness statements & contact information, photographs, medical records of treatment, and videos. Write down everything that happened immediately after it took place.

YOU ARE ONLY REQUIRED TO PROVIDE YOUR:

NAME | DATE OF BIRTH | ADDRESS

YOU DO NOT NEED TO ANSWER ANY FBI OR POLICE QUESTIONS ABOUT YOUR CITIZENSHIP STATUS

Only Immigration Customs & Enforcement (ICE) can ask about your immigration status

If mistreated, do not resist arrest or fight with any police officers. Write down their names, badge numbers, & any other information.

YOUR RIGHTS: THINGS TO REMEMBER

DO NOT:

Do not lie or provide false information

Do not permit police/FBI to enter your home/office or search your property (car, backpack, purse, etc) without a warrant If they have a warrant, ask to see it. It should be signed by a judge.

DO:

Demand to have a lawyer present when speaking to any law enforcement & answering questions

Document the interaction as best as you can: get the name, badge number, and phone number of any agent

WHAT ARE CIVIL RIGHTS?

and where do they come from?

You have the right to be treated fairly and equally – by individuals, establishments, and the government. In the USA, these come from the Constitution, court rulings, & federal and state laws

YOU DO NOT HAVE TO BE A UNITED STATES CITIZEN TO BE ENTITILED TO CIVIL RIGHTS!

1st Amendment: freedom of religious practice, speech, press, & the right to peaceably assemble and petition the government

4th Amendment: freedom from unreasonable search & seizure

Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act: prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, & gender at the workplace.
