## PLOT - POINTS

Everything begins with *pathos*, or affect. It is something that forces one to think. This hook -Plot-Point- the metaphorical narrative tendency is what the show explores through the works of 11 artists. The exhibition undertakes a Barthecian way of exploring the notion of identity and its ever-evolving status through the ecologies of migration, land, and power.

Where the practices on display are diverse in the use of materials and media, the underlying concerns are concurrent, at times even intersecting. This diversity allows for an amplified sensory experience of interacting with the works. The element of sound, and visual tactility enable a certain grace in interacting with the works.


The objects on display are born out of an innate desire. A desire subjected to a number of readings by each practitioner. It is in this process of readings that this said desire opens up a wide range of source material ultimately carrying the work as a *'network of readings'*. It is here that each of the physical works becomes a phantasmagoria of research.

What becomes of utmost relevance are the many parallels each artist draws to 'objects', 'icons', styles, and epochs. The nonchalance with which they begin to affect our reading of each work and the show by consequence is refreshingly engaging.

















Satyajit Dave is an Independent Curator and Art Consultant working in the Visual Arts sector. After pursuing a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree in Art History and Aesthetics from the Faculty of Fine Arts, Maharaja Sayajirao University of Vadodara, he was selected as the CriticIn-Residence for the PEERS 2016 residency at KHOJ in New Delhi. His work as a Research Director for the CONA Foundation enabled him to work towards its prestigious textile project Escape in a Diorama for the Whitworth Museum in Manchester in 2017.

His background in Art History and research pushes his work in the capacity of a guest faculty at various Universities like Mumbai University, Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, National Institute of Fashion Technology (under the purview of Ministry of Culture), Amity University Mumbai on subjects such as Indian Art and Architecture History, Western Art and Architecture History, Visual Culture Analysis, Curating Art, Design and Architecture, amongst the many diverse subjects.

He regularly contributes to various magazines and journals in the capacity of a writer and subject expert. His recent curatorial project is a Mega exhibition titled 'The Print: Matter in Matrix' which opened at the Shridharani Gallery at the Triveni Kala Sangam in New Delhi. The exhibition explored printmaking in India across five sections, Academic Practice, The Book, Digital and Alternative Printing, Reproductions, and 3-D Printing through the works of over 60 artists across these sections.
