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

COVID-19: The New Normal

- This quarter has seen relatively fewer cases of COVID-19 compared to the rest of the year. Arunachal Pradesh saw an all time low of new cases in this quarter.
- Vaccination drives were conducted across the state, with healthcare
 workers covering the remotest of regions to ensure that all citizens in
 the state are vaccinated as soon as possible.
- Lumla Circle, the area where we are located, has slowly eased into a new normal with schools and stores resuming regular activities.
- At Jhamtse Gatsal, we continue to be vigilant, following our lockdown and quarantine protocols. All supplies are quarantined for 3 days before they are accessed for usage.



Workshops and Programs

- Two of our primary teachers, Minoti Singha and Padmini Maurya, took part in a 6-day workshop to integrate art and learning curriculum, conducted by Art Sparks.
- Through this workshop, they focused on learning to teach problem solving, observational skills, and collaboration through art.
- They are now implementing the action-based lesson plans with their children and have received encouraging feedback from their students.
- Some of the aspects they worked on are Exploring materials, Child
 development in visual arts, Introduction to art education, and
 Robust art teaching methodology using different material like paint,
 clay, collage paper, and self-portraits through integration of flexible
 thinking through exploration, and using detailed observation.



Hiring and Legal Status

Hiring

 We hired a Middle School Science teacher, Rashmi, who completed her quarantine and has settled into the Community. She has begun teaching classes.

Legal Status

- After successfully registering for the Section 12A and 80G of the Income

 Tax Act, which were mandatory for NGOs to receive funds from

 sources in India, we were also successful in registering for form CSR-1,

 which is mandatory for receiving any CSR funding or participating in

 CSR related activities in India.
- With this, we have completed all the paperwork necessary for our financial operation within and outside of India.

Community Outreach and Engagement

- Gen Lobsang La hosted a women's group, Women Against Social Evil (WASE) from Pasighat district in eastern Arunachal Pradesh. The WASE group members are all mothers who have come together to fight the issues of drug addiction in their children, which is increasing in central and eastern Arunachal Pradesh.
- They spent a day at the Community learning about our practices, ranging from familial care to waste management strategies. They were very touched and inspired by the story and vision of Jhamtse.
- It was a very emotional moment for everyone present to hear about the love and passion with which these mothers were fighting for their children's future. They moved our children and staff to tears sharing their journey in crusading against drug and alcohol abuse in their region.

Community Outreach and Engagement

- In early December, the Honourable Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh, Shri Pema Khandu, along with other dignitaries of the state visited Jhamtse Gatsal, for the inauguration of our new family house and laying the foundation stone of our Kitchen and Dining Complex.
- Gen Lobsang La shared with them our educational model and how
 Jhamtse Gatsal aims to be a center of learning excellence for the state
 and beyond.

Awards and Recognition

- Gen Lobsang La was one of ten achievers from different fields in Arunachal Pradesh, like education, literature, environment, who were invited to interact with the Hon'ble Vice President of India, Venkaiah Naidu, in the first week of October. The panel discussed various aspects of development of the state, such as education, environment, tourism, etc.
- In the last week of November, Gen Lobsang Phuntsok La was honoured for his work in the field of transformative education, sustainable development, and social entrepreneurship in the Mon region by *Monpa Mimang Tsokpa*, an NGO which aims to unite and work towards the development of all people of the *Monpa* tribe.



Community Outreach and Engagement

- In the first week of December, we hosted a group of eight teachers who teach in a government school in a neighboring village, Mukto. Gen Lobsang La gave them a presentation on Jhamtse Gatsal's educational model on how children can be brought up with a gardening mindset as opposed to a carpentry mindset.
- Gen Lobsang La was invited to give an online talk to educators of
 The University of Edinburgh on The Three Essentials of the 21st
 Century. In the webinar, Gen Lobsang La talked about how important it is for children to receive an integrated education of the heart, mind, and body.




Family Houses

- The farming team also worked on preparing the farms for upcoming spring. They collected seeds and preserved them for our seed conservation initiative.



Progress in Academics



Academics at School

- Having completed their quarantine, all the children resumed classes at the beginning of October. The teachers and children demonstrated a lot of dedication and perseverance in catching up with their studies as there were several challenges with online classes during the second wave of COVID-19.
- Nonetheless, with the support of the Community, all the children were able to write their half-yearly exams successfully.
- Due to the shortened academic year, we weren't able to conduct elections to select the student representatives. However, two students from Grade 11 volunteered to be the school representatives. The cabinet was also chosen for the year.

School Activities

Jhamtse Media Club

• Our High School Geography teacher and Sports coach, Tenzin D., has started a media club in addition to the after-school activities around music and sports. The media club focuses on teaching children photography, videography, and writing for social media.

Little Socrates Club

• Two of our teachers, Sampurna G. and Ophelia L., have organized a club called the Little Socrates Club. They envision this club to be a space where children debate and discuss concepts like beauty, science, religion, philosophy, and more.

Code to Enhance Learning

• Four of our middle school children took part in an online coding programme, where each child was taught to code using an app called PocketCode. The children learned to make animation, games, and videos, which can help create awareness on the problems they see around them — like climate change and plastic pollution.

School Activities

Learning with Smartphones

Minoti Singha, our primary school teacher was chosen for a campaign,
#LikeATeacher run by digital media platform The Better India in
collaboration with smartphone company Nokia. As a part of the
campaign, 12 teachers were chosen from across the country and given 4
smartphones which could be used towards digital empowerment of
their students. The students spend an hour every day in groups
listening to audio stories, working on apps like Duolingo and learning
Maths through activities and educational video channels like Khan
Academy.

Sports Leadership - The Huracán Foundation

• Our High School Geography teacher and Sports coach, Tenzin D., has been selected to receive a grant from The Huracán Foundation. With the support of the Foundation, Tenzin hopes to increase girls' participation in sports and focus on inculcating transformational education through sports. He is determined to use sports to instill in children the values of commitment, discipline, and hard work.

University and Gap Year Students

University Students

- Some of our university students remain on campus, attending online classes due to the constantly fluctuating status of COVID-19 in India.
 The children who are at University have been safe and well on their campuses.
- All the children pursuing higher education have given their end of semester examinations and are gearing up for their next semester.

Gap Year Program

• After Grade 12, the children embark on a Gap Year — a bridge course between Grade 12 and beyond. Students indulge in a one-year long journey of self-exploration and understanding their role in fulfilling Jhamtse Gatsal's vision, while being prepared for the world. We currently have six students pursuing the gap year, focusing on acquiring emotional resilience, 21st century skills, leadership and management skills as well as healthy lifestyle habits for a self-reliant journey into adulthood.



- The children and the Amalas have expressed their deepest gratitude to all the supporters of Jhamtse who have made it possible for them to have a beautiful family house to share with each other.

















Kitchen-Dining Complex

- The Biome team visited the site in order to ensure that the drawings were in line with the on-ground conditions.
- Upon their request, we then conducted a detailed survey of the site so that we will be able to mark the building foundations on the ground more accurately to receive a more accurate Bill of Quantities.

Rainwater Harvesting
